AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 4-6, ARTICLE IX, CHARLOTTE COUNTY CODE, CREATING THE ROTONDA LAKES STREET AND DRAINAGE UNIT, DESCRIBING THE GEOGRAPHIC TERRITORY INCLUDED WITHIN THE UNIT, PROVIDING THE PURPOSE OF THE UNIT, PROVIDING FOR A GOVERNING BODY; PROVIDING THE POWERS OF THE GOVERNING BODY; PROVIDING THE AUTHORITY AND PROCEDURE FOR IMPOSING AND COLLECTING MAINTENANCE AND CAPITAL PROJECT ASSESSMENTS; PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF DEBT OBLIGATIONS; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

RECITALS

1. The Board of County Commissioners, pursuant to the provisions of Section 125.01, Florida Statutes, has the power to establish, merge or abolish municipal service benefit units and levy and collect assessments within such units.

2. The Board of County Commissioners, by Resolution 96-0910A0, accepted for maintenance certain described streets, bridges and related drainage facilities within the Rotonda development.

3. It is in the best interest of the citizens of the County to create street and drainage benefit units to provide the funding necessary for the construction and repair of the streets, bridges and related drainage facilities which have been accepted for maintenance.

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Section 1, Charlotte County Code, Chapter 4-6, Article IX is amended by adding the following new language, numbered and designated as follows:

"ARTICLE IX. ROTONDA LAKES STREET AND DRAINAGE UNIT

Sec. 4-6-161. Unit established.

There is hereby created, pursuant to the authority contained in Section 125.01, Florida Statutes, a municipal service benefit unit to be known as Rotonda Lakes Street and Drainage Unit (hereinafter "unit").

Sec. 4-6-162. Territory.

The territory included within the unit shall include the following portions of the unincorporated area of Charlotte County:

(1) Rotonda Lakes, a subdivision lying in the following half-section maps received October 3, 1996 from the Charlotte County Property Appraiser, Charlotte County, Florida: 2B13N, 3B17N, 3B17S, 3B18N, 3B18S, 3B19N, and 3B19S.

(2) Rotonda Lakes Unit Two, a subdivision lying in the following half-section maps received October 3, 1996 from the Charlotte County Property Appraiser, Charlotte County, Florida: 3B17N, and 3B17S.

(3) Portions of unplatted land lying in the south ½ of Section 17, Township 41 South, Range 21 East, in Charlotte County, Florida, according to the following half-section maps received October 3, 1996 from the Charlotte County Property Appraiser, Charlotte County Florida: 3B17S. Said portions being:

Parcels 2, 3, 4, 5, and 7.

Sec. 4-6-163. Purpose.

The purpose of the unit is to provide for the construction, reconstruction, repair, paving, repaving, hard surfacing, rehard surfacing, widening, guttering, and draining, of streets, bridges and related drainage facilities in the unit, and of necessary appurtenances and accessory structures thereto located within or without the unit, from funds derived from special assessments within the unit.

Sec. 4-6-164. Governing body.

The Board of County Commissioners of Charlotte County, Florida, shall be the governing body of the unit.

Sec. 4-6-165. Powers of the governing body.

The board shall have those powers set forth in Chapter 4-6, Article I, Charlotte County Code.

Sec. 4-6-166. Assessments and Collection.

The authority and procedure for imposing and collecting capital project and maintenance assessments shall be as provided in Chapter 4-6, Article I, Charlotte County Code.

Sec. 4-6-167. Issuance of debt obligations.

The authority and procedure regarding the issuance of debt obligations shall be as provided in Chapter 4-6, Article I, Charlotte County Code."

Section 2. Severability. In the event any portion of the foregoing conflicts with any other Charlotte County Code or other applicable law, the more restrictive shall apply. If any subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of these sections is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional

by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the chapter.

Section 3 Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect upon its filing in the Office of Secretary of State, State of Florida.





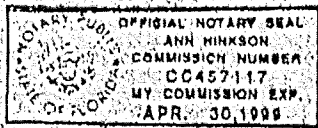
