We have been working diligently to ensure our facilities are safe, work with our insurance carrier for the replacement of insured items, and are working with the Federal Government on assistance with items that didn't have insurance coverage. WHO IS COMMUNITY SERVICES?

Charlotte County Community Services is committed to providing quality programs and facilities for residents and visitors to our county. We believe recreation and leisure activities, reading, music, art, and history are essential to personal growth, positive self-esteem, and relaxation. Our parks and open spaces are an integral part of our community identity.

There are five divisions within Community Services dedicated to providing these services: Administration, Extension Service, Libraries and History, Parks and Natural Resources, and Recreation.

Extension Service

Charlotte County Extension Service is a partnership between the University of Florida's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (UF/IFAS), the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), and Charlotte County government, to provide scientific knowledge and expertise to the public. Operating as part of the University's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences, Extension provides information and conducts educational programs on issues such as sustainable agriculture, fisheries and marine issues, competitiveness in world markets, horticulture, water quality and quantity, natural resource conservation, food safety, child and family development, and youth development.

Libraries and History

The Libraries and History Division provides materials, assistance, and computers to meet the information and recreation needs of the community; meeting spaces for community groups and businesses; historic preservation and exhibits; programs and events to support literacy, lifelong learning, and educating the community about the history of Charlotte County by operating four libraries and specialized services.

Parks and Natural Resources

Parks and Natural Resources Division enhances quality of life by providing safe, well maintained, accessible park and athletic facilities for all users including athletic fields, beaches, parks and conservation lands, playgrounds, fishing piers, and boat ramps; managing and safeguarding natural ecosystems for public access for passive recreation and environmental education; enhancing community life by preserving clean air and water, conservation of wildlife and natural resources, and management of Habitat Conservation Plans.

Recreation

The Recreation Division operates six Recreation Centers and four Aquatic Facilities; programs various activities and events for participants of all ages; provides summer and break camp for children grades K-8; coordinates special interest classes for the public; develops and implements youth and adult sport activities to promote active lifestyles; provides swimming lessons and aquatic safety training for the public; coordinates athletic facility usage by youth and adult sports leagues; provides special events for community enjoyment and economic benefit; and schedules and rents facilities, including the Charlotte Sports Park, the Spring Training Home of the Tampa Bay Rays.

Special Event Permits

Looking for a place to hold your special event? Charlotte County Community Services offers a wide variety of facilities, parks, and open space to hold events from 100 to 1,000 and more. Certain events require a temporary use permit from the Community Development Department Zoning Division. Examples of temporary use permit requirements are:

- Outdoor sales, parking lot sales or tent sales of merchandise, products, services, or other commercial activities
- Event uses, such as fairs, carnivals, circuses, and expositions
- Fund-raising events conducted off-site by charitable organizations, nonprofit corporations, or school groups, as well as promotions, sales and other activities by charitable organizations, nonprofit corporations, or school groups
- Temporary religious or revival activities
- Any other temporary use similar in nature to the ones listed above, as determined by the zoning official

PARKING PASSES

Applying for or Renewing Your Annual Parking Pass

Parking Passes are available for purchase for three different lengths of time for those who frequently visit and enjoy our beautiful Charlotte County beaches and boat ramps. We encourage beach and boat ramp patrons to renew or apply for a new parking pass by mail.

- Annual Effective for one year from the month of purchase with a cost of \$50.00 (plus \$3.50 tax) = \$53.50.
- 6 month Effective for 6 months from the month of purchase with a cost of 335.00 (plus \$2.45 tax) = \$37.45.
- 3 month Effective for 3 months from the month of purchase with a cost of \$25.00 (plus \$1.75 tax) = \$26.75.

RENTAL INFORMATION

RENTAL INFORMATION:

Amenities and meeting rooms are offered to the public on a first come, first served basis. We are always available to serve you, Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., by calling 941.681.3742, to make your reservations. Or call 941.625.PLAY if you cannot reach staff at any of our facilities. A Facility Park Use questionnaire must be completed and rental fees for reserved exclusive use are required based on the following categories:

Category 1: Any individual renting facilities for a private function or a recreational class or a not-for-profit organization renting facilities for an organizational function, to raise funds for charity, or for the maintenance of an organization.

Category 2: Commercial, business, or individual renting facilities for the purpose of publicity, advertising, sales, or any other for-profit purposes. Floor plans for each recreation center can be found on our website under Facility & Pavilion Rental Information.

Damage Deposit

There is a \$100 deposit per one-time event rental (over 30 people and/ or use of alcohol). The deposit will be required and must accompany the returned contract. This deposit is refundable after facility inspection.

Insurance

Reserving any facility, shelter, or open space within Charlotte County Community Services is a contractual agreement and may require insurance. The specific type and amount of insurance required is dependent upon the nature of the activity, program, or event that will be occurring.

Alcohol

The consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited in any County parks and recreation facility located within a Community Redevelopment Area AND between sunset and sunrise in all other parks and recreation facilities, except where alcoholic consumption is expressly authorized by the terms of a County lease, outdoor festival license, or other similar County event or temporary use permit.

Charlotte Harbor CRA - Bayshore Live Oak Park, Katherine Ariens Dog Park, Chester Roberts Park - Live Oak Point Park Murdock Village CRA - Centennial Park Parkside CRA - McGuire Park, Lake Betty Park

Note: Always bring your rental permit with you to the park you are visiting. If you have a permit and find another park patron(s) occupying the facility you have rented who refuses to vacate the facility, you may contact the Charlotte County Sheriff's Non-Emergency phone number 941.639.2101 to resolve the situation.

Recreation Centers and Libraries Reservations

Recreation centers and libraries offer an assortment of facilities and rooms to accommodate a variety of meetings and events. Amenities at some of the centers include kitchens, public address systems, and stages. All centers have tables and chairs available for a variety of seating configurations. Staff will recommend physical arrangements to meet your event size. Call the facility for specifics on rooms and available amenities. Room rentals are based on the size of the room.

Each branch offers a variety of onsite materials, laptop computers, printing and copy services, technology device assistance, reader's advisory, meeting rooms and study areas, and various programs. Makerspaces offer accessibility to select resources: 3D printers, sewing machines, Cricut machines, video editing software, laser cutter, and CNC machine (resources vary per branch). This two-story facility, originally built in 1968, is the oldest library in Charlotte County. It has been renovated several times, most recently in 2021. It is 13,000 square feet and serves the Parkside and surrounding communities by providing books, movies, music, digital resources, free Wi-Fi, laptops for use in the building, and comfortable seating for work or study. Library staff are available for reading recommendations and assistance with technology, printing, and more. The second floor contains an interactive learning space for children and teens; a Makerspace with a 3D printer, Cricut smart cutting machines, sewing machine and video editing software as well as a conference table for up to 12 people; and a meeting room with seating for up to 50 people which is available for rental. The Friends of the Port Charlotte Library bookstore is located directly next door.

Located on over six beautifully landscaped acres adjacent to the Linear Park, the 20,000 square foot Punta Gorda Charlotte Library offers southern Charlotte County residents and visitors: a large youth department with an interactive learning wall and iPads for in-library use; separate teen room with gaming area; Makerspace with sewing machines, 3D printer, Cricut cutting machine and Boss Laser Cutter; two small study rooms; 12 laptops with wireless printing capabilities; spacious reading and study areas for adults, including an outdoor atrium area with rocking chairs and a Local History Reading Room; and Friends of the Library bookstore. Additionally, the facility provides an ongoing display of local artwork and houses an archival collection. Two meeting rooms are available for rental; when combined the rooms hold up to 140 seated participants.

Rules for Dog Parks:

- Dogs entering or leaving the park must be on a leash (voice command is not sufficient).
- Dog owners must be in the fenced area within view of their dogs.
- Dogs should be under voice control.
- No more than two dogs per person on any one visit.
- No animals other than dogs are allowed inside the park.
- Food is not allowed in the park.
- Smoking is not allowed in the park.
- Be polite, scoop the poop!
- Bag stations and trash cans are available.
- Fill any hole your dog digs.
- Aggressive dogs are not permitted on the premises.
- Dogs must be removed from the dog park at the first sign of aggression.
- Dogs must wear current license tags.
- Dogs must be current on rabies vaccines.
- Female dogs in heat are prohibited from entering the park.
- Dogs 4 months or younger are not allowed inside the park.

Rules for Dog-Friendly Parks:

- Dogs must be leashed at all times.
- Dog owners are responsible for the clean-up and removal of their dog's feces.
- Dog owners are required to remain inside of the park with their animals. Dogs may not be left unattended at any time.
- No more than two dogs per person on any one visit.
- Dogs only.
- Dogs must wear a collar with a current license attached.
- Dogs must be current on rabies vaccines.
- Female dogs in heat are prohibited.
- Dogs 4 months of age or under are prohibited.
- Dogs are not allowed on athletic fields.
- Owners should fill in any holes that their dog digs.
- Owners should be respectful of others.
- Aggressive dogs are not permitted.
- At the first sign of aggression the owner must remove their dog.

Contact Charlotte County Sheriff Non-Emergency at 941.639.2101 for assistance with aggressive dogs that are not properly addressed.

Many families cannot afford the luxury of providing quality park time with their dogs, separate from the time they can spend with their children. If you choose to bring your child to the dog park, it is very important for your child's safety that you supervise your child closely. The safest place for your child while in the dog park is standing by your side or holding your hand. If you choose to let your child play within the dog area, please read the following guidelines:

Kid Safety Procedures

- Never run with the dogs
- Always ask the owner before petting a dog you don't know
- Stay close to parents while in the park

IF A STRANGE DOG CHARGES AT YOU:

- Hide face, fold arms, and stand still "like a tree"
 - IF YOU ARE KNOCKED TO THE GROUND:
- Lie down
- Tuck arms and legs into the body and lie "like a log"
- Wait until an adult arrives or the dog leaves

Remember...

Owners are expected to know the temperament of their dog and are ultimately responsible for their actions of their dog, AT ALL TIMES, while inside of the park. Owners are NOT exempt from the Charlotte County Animal Control Ordinances in regards to dangerous/aggressive animals and may be subject to a fine of up to \$515.00 in the event a violation occurs.

ENVIRONMENTAL PARKS & CONSERVATION CHARLOTTE PRESERVES

Charlotte County Community Services invites you to experience nature's beauty at one of your environmental parks or preserves. Walk through the beautiful pine flatwoods and wetlands at Charlotte Flatwoods, bring your binoculars to view migratory and wading birds around Lemon Lake at Amberjack, or hike to the top of "Mount Tippecanoe" for a scenic view. Come and explore natural Florida in Charlotte County.

All trails are open from sunrise to sunset. Trail maps for each environmental park and Conservation Charlotte Preserve are available on the Charlotte County Parks and Natural Resources webpage at CharlotteCountyFL.gov. For more information on any of the environmental parks preserves, please call the Department's Environmental Land Management Specialist at 941.613.3220.

ENVIRONMENTAL PARKS

Amberjack Environmental Park

Amberjack Environmental Park is a 225 acre preserve made up of rare and unique scrub, pine flatwoods, marshes, and other beautiful natural areas, located on the southern half of the Cape Haze peninsula. Many different wildflowers can be seen blooming year-round in these habitats. Amberjack Environmental Park is traversed by two wetlands, one that formed the headwaters of a tributary to the Lemon Bay Aquatic Preserve, and one that drains into the west branch of Coral Creek. They are havens for several species of wading birds, including great blue herons, glossy ibis, roseate spoonbills, and snowy egrets.

The park is located on the southern half of the Cape Haze peninsula in Englewood. Travel west on SR 776 (from Port Charlotte) and turn left onto CR 775 (Placida Rd). Drive approximately 4.3 miles and turn left on Gasparilla Pines Blvd.. Drive to the end of Gasparilla Pines and the park is on the right side of the road. This park has ADA accessible trails.

Ann & Chuck Dever Regional Park and Oyster Creek Environmental Park

Ann & Chuck Dever Regional Park encompasses over 250 acres of environmental lands. In the park you will find a sanctuary of old growth pines, scrub habitat, and mature pine flatwoods with mangrove fringe along Oyster Creek. Throughout these areas gopher tortoises have been observed, and along the creek perching snags are commonly used by osprey and the bald eagle. The boardwalk crossing Oyster Creek displays the variety of birds that utilize Oyster Creek and the surrounding tidal mangroves. The wetlands and mangroves provide habitat for wading birds species such as the wood stork, white ibis, roseate spoonbill, little blue heron, reddish egret, snowy egret, limpkins, and tricolored heron. The parks are located in Englewood south of SR 776. Oyster Creek Entrance: Travel west on SR 776 (from Port Charlotte) and turn left onto 775 (Placida Rd). Immediately after Lemon Bay High School the Park is on the left side across the street from Cedar Point. This park has ADA accessible trails.

Ann & Chuck Dever Regional Park Entrance: Travel west on SR 776 (from Port Charlotte) and turn left onto San Casa Drive, the Park is on the right side of the road, use the skate park entrance, approximately 2 miles, the Preserve is on the right side of the road. This park has ADA accessible trails.

Cedar Point Environmental Park

Cedar Point is one of the last remaining large tracts of undeveloped land on Lemon Bay in Charlotte County. Cedar Point has pine flatwoods, scrub, scrubby flatwoods, mangrove swamps, salt marshes, and wetlands. Many species of animals inhabit pine flatwoods at Cedar Point, including bobcat, grey fox, yellow rat snake, pileated woodpecker, and bald eagle. Mangrove swamps are tidal wetlands that inhabit low energy shorelines in the coastal areas of southwest Florida. Mangrove trees are specially adapted to salt- and brackishwater environments. Mangroves provide habitat and nursery grounds for many species of fish and invertebrates. Situated on Lemon Bay, a long narrow estuary, Cedar Point is a great place to see wading birds in the mangrove tree pine flatwoods to find bald eagles, gopher tortoises, as well as a myriad of native plants.

The park is located in Englewood south of SR 776. Travel west on SR 776 (from Port Charlotte) and turn left onto SR 775 (Placida Rd). Immediately after Lemon Bay High School on the right is Cedar Point Environmental Park. This park has ADA accessible trails.

Charlotte Flatwoods Environmental Park

Charlotte Flatwoods Environmental Park is 487 acres of mature pine flatwoods, hydric pine flatwoods, dry prairie, depressional marsh wetlands, and permanent freshwater ponds. Charlotte Flatwoods Environmental Park abuts both Southwest Florida Water Management preserve lands as well as Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission preserve lands, creating an important wildlife corridor to the Babcock/Webb Wildlife Management Area.

The depressional marsh wetlands and larger slough system are home to several species of wading birds, as well as a family of sandhill cranes. The wetland areas also provide habitat for a wide assortment of reptiles and amphibians including the American alligator, banded water snake, and cricket frogs. Bobcats, deer, otters, and turkeys can be observed roaming through the pine flatwoods and dry prairies.

Cedar Point Environmental Park is one of Charlotte County's unique environmental parks. Situated on Lemon Bay, a long narrow estuary, Cedar Point is a great place to see beautiful wading birds that visit the mangrove fringe and adjacent seagrasses. The pine flatwoods are home to a pair of bald eagles, as well as gopher tortoises and a myriad of native plants.

This park has ongoing environmental programs which include nature walks and exploratory wading trips. Also located at this park is the Cedar Point Environmental Center, where you can find a variety of information and displays. Charlotte County Community Services has contracted with the Charlotte Harbor Environmental Center (CHEC), a non-profit organization, to provide free environmental programs on this and each of the County's environmental parks. Be sure to watch for programs as they are scheduled. For more information about programs and nature walks or the park call 941.475.0769 or 941.613.3220.



The park is located in southern Punta Gorda, near the County line. Travel south on US 41 past Punta Gorda. The park is located on the northwest corner of Zemel Rd & US 41. A parking area is located to the right directly off US 41. This park has ADA accessible trails.

Tippecanoe Environmental Park

Tippecanoe Environmental Park is a 380 acre preserve with a diverse assortment of habitats including oak scrub, scrubby flatwoods, coastal hammocks, floodplain forests, salt marshes, and mangrove swamps. Scrub provides the ideal habitat for the Florida scrub-jay, as well as other protected species such as the gopher tortoise, eastern indigo snake, and gopher frog. Tippecanoe Environmental Park also boasts a rich history with multiple shell middens on the property, some dating as far back as 2,500 years.

The park is located in the El Jobean area of Port Charlotte. Travel onto SR 776 toward the El Jobean area. The park is located behind the Charlotte Sports Park Stadium, 2300 El Jobean Road. This park has ADA accessible trails.

Bill Coy Preserve

This 80.84 acre preserve is located along the northern section of Buck Creek on the Cape Haze Peninsula. The entire preserve is comprised of native habitat, predominantly scrubby flatwoods, and mesic pine flatwoods. These flatwoods transition into coastal hammock and mangrove swamp along Buck Creek, which flows into Lemon Bay an aquatic preserve and outstanding Florida water.

The Conservation Charlotte preserve is located along the northern section of Buck Creek on the Cape Haze Peninsula. Travel west on SR 776 (from Port Charlotte) and turn left onto CR 775 (Placida Rd). Proceed south approximately 4 miles; the Preserve is on the right side of the road.

Peace River Preserve

This 450 acre site is a mixture of scrubby flatwoods, mesic flatwoods, xeric and mesic hammocks, scattered depressional marshes, and mangrove swamp. The southern and eastern portions of this site transition into high marsh and mangrove communities that are typically flooded.

The Conservation Charlotte preserve is located in the Deep Creek area of Port Charlotte, along the western shores of the Peace River. Travel I-75 to the Kings Hwy exit, exit to the north. Turn right onto Sandhill Blvd and proceed approximately 2 miles, the Preserve is on the right side of the road.



Prairie Creek Preserve

The vast majority of this 1,603+ acre preserve is comprised of a mixture of upland habitats that have been well maintained by prescribed fires. The diverse array of habitat include scrub, scrubby flatwoods, palmetto prairies, and pine flatwoods. Prairie Creek, a tributary of Shell Creek Reservoir, traverses through the center of the

property. The property provides habitat for several listed species of wildlife, including the Florida scrub-jay, gopher tortoises, and eastern indigo snake.

The Conservation Charlotte preserve is located in eastern Charlotte County along Prairie Creek, a tributary of the Shell Creek Reservoir. Travel I-75 to the Highway 17 exit, exit to the north. Proceed approximately 7 miles; the Preserve is on the right side of the road.

Shell Creek Preserve

This 370+ acre site was the largest area of unprotected native habitat remaining along the un-channelized portion of Shell Creek. The character of the preserve is unusual for south Florida. From the waterline, the creek banks rise almost vertically for several feet indicating that this creek is geologically very old in comparison to most south Florida waterways. Cypress and bottomland hardwoods line the creek shores giving way to xeric hammock, and further landward are intermittent small areas of mesic hammock and scrub leading to large expanses of longleaf pine dominated mesic flatwoods.

The Conservation Charlotte preserve is located along the southern fork of Shell Creek in eastern Charlotte County. Travel I-75 to the Highway 17 exit, exit to the north. Turn right on Washington Loop Rd, following Washington Loop to Trails End Rd, turn right. Follow signs to the Shell Creek Preserve.

Thornton Key Preserve

Charlotte County's Thornton Key Preserve contains 31+ acres in the central portion of Thornton Key, one of Charlotte County's Gulf barrier islands. The Preserve contains valuable habitat such as tropical coastal hammock that includes several rare plant species, mangrove swamps, salt barrens, and herbaceous marshes. The preserve is one of the few examples of tropical hardwood hammock habitat remaining in southwest Florida.

The Conservation Charlotte preserve is a barrier island in Lemon Bay south of Stump Pass and east of Palm Island; in the center portion of the island. Access to Thornton Key is by boat, canoe, or kayak only. Access through Old Knights Pass east of Palm/Knight Island – Longitude: -82.332019, Latitude: 26.889019.

Tippecanoe II

Tippecanoe II is a 182 acre mitigation preserve for the Florida scrubjay, and contains scrub habitat and scrubby flatwoods, xeric hammock, mesic flatwoods, upland mixed forest, marshes, and a small area of palm hammock. These habitats, home to Florida scrub-jay, are also home to other listed species such as the gopher tortoise, the Florida mouse, Eastern indigo snake, and gopher frog. The park is located in the El Jobean area of Port Charlotte. Travel onto SR 776 toward the El Jobean area. Turn onto Flamingo Blvd. and again onto Joppa Ave. The park is located at 16259 Joppa Ave., Port Charlotte, FL 33948.

STATE PARKS

Stump Pass State Park

900 Gulf Blvd., Englewood, FL 34233 (*Map Key - H*) 941.964.0375

At the southwest corner of Charlotte County, there is a mile of beach where seashells and shark teeth wash up, and anglers fish the surf for prize catches. Visitors can enjoy an excellent view of the Gulf of Mexico, as well as a stretch of undeveloped Florida coastline. Visitors come to this secluded beach to enjoy the year-round swimming and sunbathing; shelling is best during the winter months. A hiking trail passes through five distinct natural communities that provide homes for many species of wildlife; covered picnic tables are located along the trail. While at the park, visitors might see West Indian manatees, gopher tortoises, snowy egrets, least terns, and magnificent frigatebirds. Ranger-led nature hikes are available in the winter.

Don Pedro State Park

8450 Placida Road, Cape Haze, FL 33946 (*Map Key - C*) 941.964.0375

This beautiful park is part of an extensive chain of barrier islands extending along Florida's Gulf Coast. Between Knight Island and Little Gasparilla Island, Don Pedro is accessible only by private boat or ferry. Boaters can tie up at the dock on the mangrove-lined bay side of the island. Access the dock via the channel south of the Cape Haze power line crossing, but be sure to idle, as the channel is only 2.5 feet deep. Keep your eyes peeled for endangered species such as West Indian manatees, gopher tortoises, bald eagles, and American oystercatchers. With one mile of white sand beach, enjoy sunbathing, swimming, snorkeling, and shelling on Don Pedro's Gulf side. Boat and surf fishing are other favorite pastimes of visitors to the 230 acre park. Hikers and nature lovers can explore trails of the Park's land base portion on the Cape Haze Peninsula. The 100 acre land base also offers a fishing dock, nature trails, and a picnic shelter.

Charlotte Harbor Preserve State Park

12301 Burnt Store Road, Punta Gorda, FL 33955 (*Map Key - B*) 941.575.5861

This park is comprised of 42,000 acres and protects 70 miles of shoreline along Charlotte Harbor in Charlotte and Lee Counties. Visitors can take advantage of opportunities to hike, fish, paddle, and observe wildlife in the park's many natural communities, including mangrove forests, marshes, scrub habitats, and pine flatwoods. Most of the park is shallow water fringed by mangroves, providing amazing

opportunities to view wading birds, manatees, dolphins, and other wildlife. The park is best accessed by kayak or canoe. Portions of two paddle trail systems wind through the park. Hikers and bird-watchers can access Charlotte Harbor's upland areas at pedestrian walkthroughs available in each section of the park, and explore the wildlife found along three marked trails. Visitors can also enjoy the resources provided by the Charlotte Harbor Environmental Center (CHEC) located in the park. Visitors are welcome to explore other areas of the Preserve, unless posted as closed, but should be aware that these areas are a remote and primitive wilderness. Visitors should take a compass, a map, and sufficient water for their trip. No restrooms or drinking water are available.

The Alligator Creek Preserve includes four miles of nature trails. Year-round volunteers offer interpretive trail walks to the public free of charge. Cedar Point Location

Cedar Point Environmental Park was purchased by Charlotte County in 1992, the trails established in 1995, and the Visitor Center opened to the public in 1998. This is a 115 acre Charlotte County Park that borders Ainger Creek, Oyster Creek, and Lemon Bay. The Visitor's Center is free and open to the public. Three trails lead directly to Lemon Bay. NATURAL RESOURCES

Natural Resources helps to protect, restore, and conserve the environmental resources of Charlotte County, such as the valuable ecosystems, along with plant and animal species. Natural Resources reviews development activity proposed within Charlotte County for potential impacts state or federally listed wildlife. Natural Resources is also tasked with managing Charlotte County's environmental lands. Charlotte County has been acquiring environmentally sensitive lands since the mid 1990s through direct purchases, grant funds and, in 2006, the voters approved Conservation Charlotte program. CHARLOTTE COUNTY'S ARTIFICIAL REEF PROGRAM

Starting in the 1950s, local businesses and clubs were deploying materials to create artificial reefs in the Gulf of Mexico. In 1960, the first documented Charlotte County reef was deployed in the Gulf of Mexico, the Englewood Fish Haven, consisting of materials from a bridge in Englewood. In 1982, the State created the State's Artificial Reef Program to assist local governments in building artificial reefs. From 1981 to 2008, the local Sea Grant Agents assisted Charlotte County government, local businesses, and fishing clubs in developing and implementing the County's Artificial Reef Program. In 2009, the program was passed on to Charlotte County's Parks & Natural Resources Division. Today, with the help of local dive groups, fishing clubs, and local businesses, the program continues to thrive.

Several studies have shown that artificial reefs are extensively used and generate millions of dollars to the local economy. In 2009, a study of Charlotte County artificial reefs generated nearly \$23 million dollars in net economic impacts annually that supports 306 full and part time jobs within the County.



BEACH NESTING BIRDS

Part of the Florida beach experience is enjoying the beautiful seabirds and shorebirds, from elegant white egrets to splendid black skimmers and graceful terns. Beachgoers are fortunate to observe a tremendous variety of birds along beaches which are critical to shorebird nesting. These stretches of beach provide a place where shorebirds can lay their eggs and raise their young, as they prefer isolated undisturbed areas. Florida coastline stretches nearly 1,200 statute miles with 13 million people living on or near the coast and another 50 million people visiting the beaches to vacation. With the coastline experiencing rapid growth and widespread coastal development, shorebirds and seabirds have few places left to go. Due to the decline in undisturbed beaches, nesting shorebirds utilize the same beaches as the public. Repeated disruptions from people and pets can cause the birds to take flight and endanger the survival of the eggs and chicks. Protecting shorebirds and seabirds in Florida is no small task. Realizing that the conservation and management of these species is beyond the reach of any one agency or organization, Charlotte County staff and volunteers, along with local and regional partnerships, maintain collaborative efforts to educate the general public and protect nesting sites. Each year, February through September, a portion of our beaches, known as historical nesting sites, are roped and posted to promote successful nesting. Volunteer Shorebird Stewards monitor nesting activity and conduct educational outreach informing the general public about shorebird nesting activity.



SEA TURTLE PROTECTION

Sea turtles are reptiles in a shell; their bodies are covered by a thick, sturdy surface which provides protection for their soft, inner body and sensitive organs. Sea spend their entire lives in the ocean, only coming ashore to lay eggs and carry on a new generation. In Florida, their nesting season runs from May through October. The females make their way back to the very beach they were hatched from to lay their eggs.

Sea turtles will lay a clutch of eggs, averaging 50-200 eggs, depending upon the species. Survival rates for hatchlings are extraordinarily low; it is said only 1 in 1,000 hatchlings will reach adulthood. Artificial lighting is reported as the #1 cause of hatchling mortality. Landward lights can disorient adults and hatchlings which depend upon the illuminated horizon for direction. Therefore, it is very important to turn off any unnecessary lights and leave your flashlights at home. Other threats to sea turtles include pollution, temporary structures left on the beach overnight, fishing line and other ocean debris, floating balloons or plastic bags which resemble jellyfish, and dogs running at-large on the beach.

Charlotte County staff and sea turtle volunteers walk our beaches regularly to monitor nesting activities and ensure protection of these very important species.





Owners are NOT exempt from the Charlotte County Animal Control Ordinances in regards to dangerous/aggressive animals and may be subject to a fine of up to \$515.00 in the event a violation occurs.

(Ordinance #98-70, Section 1-4-31, Section E)

Rules for Paw Parks:

- Dogs entering or leaving the park must be on a leash (voice command is not sufficient).
- Dog owners must be in the fenced area within view of their dogs.
- Dogs should be under voice control.
- No more than two dogs per person on any one visit.
- No animals other than dogs are allowed in the park.
- No glass containers are allowed inside of the park.
- Food is not allowed in the park.
- Smoking is not allowed in the park.
- Be polite, scoop the poop!
- Bag stations and trash cans are available.
- Fill any hole your dog digs.

The safest place for your child while in the dog park is standing by your side or holding your hand. If you choose to let your child play within the dog area, please read the following guidelines:

Kid Safety Procedures

- Never run with the dogs.
- Always ask the owner before petting a dog you don't know.
- Stay close to parents while in the park.

IF A STRANGE DOG CHARGES AT YOU:

• Hide face, fold arms, and stand still "like a tree."

IF YOU ARE KNOCKED TO THE GROUND:

- Lie down.
- Tuck arms and legs into the body and lie "like a log."
- Wait until an adult arrives or the dog leaves.



The Captain Don Cerbone Memorial Skate Park is a shining example of a community project made possible by the determination and commitment of private citizens, the generosity of the business community, and the support of local government.

Charlotte County Community Services offers two skate parks. All skaters must abide by the rules and have a signed waiver on file with Charlotte County. Patrons may go to any County Recreation Center or Pool to pick up and submit the waiver form. Those skaters 18 years and older may sign the waiver themselves. For children 17 years of age and younger, the waiver must be signed by a parent or guardian in front of a staff member. If it is not signed in front of a staff member, the form must be notarized. Picture ID is required at all times when using the skate parks. Our staff, as well as the local Rotary Clubs, will randomly check waivers and IDs.

REGIONAL PARKS SOUTH COUNTY REGIONAL PARK

Rules for the Skate Park:

- BMX is allowed on specific days only
- Skating is at your own risk
- Anyone under the age of 13 must be accompanied by an adult 18 or over
- All participants must have a signed waiver on file to skate
- Helmets are required by all participants at all times while they are on the skating surface. Elbow pads, knee pads, and other additional safety equipment is strongly recommended
- Scooters, motorized vehicles, or other powered devices are not allowed within the skate park
- No food or beverages within the skating area. Glass containers and chewing gum are not permitted at the facility





Ann & Chuck Dever Regional Park has over 306 acres of land, 50 acres for active use, 120 acres of environmental land, and 36 acres north of the creek. There is more to this park than a swimming pool and basketball courts. It also features a diving well, football fields, tennis courts, a cricket/multipurpose field, a dog park, a skate park, pavilion rentals, restrooms, and nature trails. The Oyster Creek Waterfront Trail connects the Ann & Chuck Dever Regional Park with Cedar Point Environmental Park. The trail allows unfettered access to both parks providing trail users the opportunity to experience both parks' marine life, water fowl, and flora from a unique perspective by allowing them to traverse Oyster Creek under SR 775. The trail can be accessed by either the Oyster Creek Environmental Park or Cedar Point Environmental Park and in part by a grant from the State of Florida Recreation Trails Program.


