The following City of North Port Commissioners were present: Vice Mayor Barbara Langdon, Commissioner Jill Luke, Commissioner Debbie McDowell, and Commissioner Alice White. The following members were absent: Mayor Pete Emrich.

a) Economic Development

Dave Gammon, Charlotte County Economic Development Director gave a brief overview of Here Are the Most Popular Cities for Homebuyers in 2022 - and the Places People Can't Wait to Leave, Where homebuyers want to live, Punta Gorda Called a Good Spot to Relocate a Business Headquarters (HQ), Development History, Charlotte and Sarasota Residential Parcel Status, Parkside Village, Sunseeker

Resort, Project Status, 24 acre site plan, Competitive set profile, Cheney Brothers Distribution Network, Babcock Ranch, Burnt Store Growth, Economic Development Office (EDO) Focus, Permanent Change of Station (PCS), ZenniHome, and ZenCity.

City Manager Fletcher gave a brief overview of Legacy Trail Connector, Warm Mineral Springs Park, Wellen Park, and North Port Ongoing Projects.

Vice Chair Constance mentioned City of Punta Gorda and data.

Sean Walter, Charlotte County Sales and Sports Marketing Manager gave a brief overview of Tourism and Most recently the tourism department partnered with the City of North Port as follows.

Vice Chair Constance spoke to Tourist Development Council (TDC) Meetings, partnership, ideas, North Port Aquatic Center, Charles Hines, connections, Legacy and Shared-Use Nonmotorized (SUN) Trail, Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), and Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC). Commissioner Tiseo discussed Cool Today Park, Charlotte Sports Park, Florida Complex Leagues, and economic drivers.

Vice Mayor Langdon mentioned Sarasota County TDC, data, community events, and partnership. Commissioner Luke commented on connection, Friends of the Legacy Trail, and extension. Commissioner McDowell noted North Port Aquatic Center, visitors, and benefits.

John Elias, Charlotte County Public Works Director responded to SUN Trail, Community Services, and extension.

Brandon Moody, Charlotte County Water Quality Manager gave a brief overview of North Port/Port Charlotte Watershed, Impaired Waterways, North Port/Charlotte Monitoring, and Water Quality Protection Activities.

Elizabeth Wong, City of North Port Stormwater Manager gave a brief overview of Big Slough Watershed, City of North Port and Charlotte County Stormwater Drainage System, North Port Water Quality Monitoring Programs, Canal Creek Water Quality Monitoring, City of North Port Canal and Creek Water Quality Monitoring Plan, Use of Sucralose as Tracer of leakage from Septic Systems, Canal Creek Water Quality Sampling Program, Canal Creek Water Quality Results November 2021 to June 2022, and Steps City has Taken to Reduce Pollutants.

Nancy Gallinaro, City of North Port Utilities Director gave a brief overview of North Port Utilities: Master Plan Project Timeline, Municipal Water & Wastewater Plan, and Vacuum Station Property Acquisition.

Vice Chair Constance spoke to Impaired Waterways, Charlotte Harbor, Peace River, seagrass, potable and reuse water, Sunshine Lake, Sunrise Waterway, North Port/Charlotte Monitoring, data, commercial

appliers, restrictions, Ordinance, retail suppliers, Babcock Ranch, xeriscaping, cost, Municipal Water & Wastewater Master Plan, watershed, septic to sewer program, partnership, benefits, funding, El Jobean, Governor Ron DeSantis, water quality, Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), environmental work program, and infrastructure. Commissioner Deutsch remarked on Ordinance, retail suppliers, responsibility, water quality, and restrictions. Commissioner Tiseo mentioned Florida-Friendly, gateways, irrigation, low maintenance, sewer expansion program, funding, cost, Master Plan Project Timeline, tax dollars, and flexibility.

Vice Mayor Langdon commented on sewer expansion program, community education and engagement, Water Summit, cost, benefits, risk, and inflation. Commissioner Luke noted North Port/Charlotte Monitoring, data, timeframe, Municipal Water & Wastewater Master Plan, Master Plan Project Timeline, and cost. Commissioner McDowell spoke to Ordinance, prohibition, Resolution, commercial restrictions, and reclaimed water. Commissioner White remarked on Florida-Friendly Landscape Workshops, alternatives, fertilizer, Flip My Florida Yard, Babcock Ranch, native vegetation, irrigation systems, cost, Ralph Mitchell, septic to sewer conversion, El Jobean, Patricia Spence, and limitations.
