# ORDINANCE

NUMBER 2003-28

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 4-5, ARTICLE XV, CHARLOTTE COUNTY CODE; AMENDING THE SOUTH CHARLOTTE STORMWATER UTILITY DISTRICT; AMENDING THE PURPOSE OF THE UNIT; AMENDING THE DEFINITIONS APPLICABLE TO THE UNIT; PROVIDING THE AUTHORITY AND PROCEDURE FOR IMPOSING AND COLLECTING MAINTENANCE AND CAPITAL PROJECT ASSESSMENTS; PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF DEBT OBLIGATIONS; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

# RECITALS

WHEREAS the Board of County Commissioners, by Ordinance 91-66, established the South Charlotte Stormwater Utility District for the purpose of planning, constructing, operating and maintaining a stormwater management system in that certain portion of Charlotte County; and

WHEREAS the Board of County Commissioners has determined that certain amendments to said municipal service benefit unit, as initially established, are needed to more efficiently provide for and fairly assess stormwater management projects and maintenance within the unit.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Charlotte County, Florida:

Section 1. The heading to Chapter 4-5, Article XV, Charlotte County Code, is amended to read as follows:

"ARTICLE XV. SOUTH CHARLOTTE STORMWATER UTILITY DISTRICT UNIT"

Section 2. Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-342 is amended to read as follows:

# "Sec. 4-5-342. Unit established.

There is hereby created, pursuant to the authority contained in F.S. Sections 125.01 and 403.0893, a municipal service benefit unit to be known as the South Charlotte Stormwater Utility District ("district") Unit ("unit")."

<u>Section 3.</u> Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-344 is amended to read as follows:

# "Sec. 4-5-344. Governing body.

The Board of County Commissioners of Charlotte County, Florida, shall be the governing body of the district unit.

Section 4. Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-345 is amended to read as follows:

# "Sec. 4-5-345. Purpose.

The purpose of the district unit is to provide for the financing, design, construction, maintenance and operation of a stormwater management system, plan for future infrastructure needs, accrue or borrow funds for future work, and carry out such work. It is not the intent of the Board of County Commissioners in either the adoption of this article or the establishment of the district unit, solely by the action of such adoption or establishment, that the district unit assume any independent liability or obligation (without regard to whether the liability or obligation arises from provision of contract, statute, administrative code or permit) of any private person or private entity. The Board, however, by separate vote, may assume such obligations in specifically identified circumstances, with the vote spread on the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners."

Section 5. Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-346 is amended to read as follows:

## "Sec. 4-5-346. Definitions.

The words and terms used in this article shall have the meanings provided in Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-286."

Section 6. Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-347 is deleted in its entirety.

Section 7. Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-348 is deleted in its entirety.

Section 8. Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-349 is deleted in its entirety.

Section 9. Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-350 is deleted in its entirety.

Section 10. Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-351 is renumbered and amended to read as follows:

# "Sec. 4-5-351 4-5-347. Powers.

The board shall have the powers enumerated in Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-287."

Section 11. Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-352 is deleted in its entirety.

Section 12. Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-353 is renumbered and amended to read as follows:

# "Sec. 4-5-353 4-5-348. Capital project assessments.

The authority and procedure for imposing capital project assessments shall be as provided in Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-288."

Section 13. Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-354 is renumbered and amended to read as follows:

# "Sec. 4-5-354 4-5-349. Maintenance assessments.

The authority and procedure for imposing maintenance assessments shall be as provided in Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-289."

Section 14. Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-355 is renumbered and amended to read as follows:

# "Sec. 4-5-355 4-5-350. Collection of non-ad valorem assessments.

The authority and procedure for collecting capital project and maintenance assessments shall be as provided in Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-290."

<u>Section 15.</u> Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-356 is renumbered and amended to read as follows:

# "Sec. 4-5-356 <u>4-5-351</u>. Issuance of debt obligations.

The authority and procedure regarding the issuance of debt obligations shall be as provided in Charlotte County Code, Section 4-5-291."

Section 16. Severability. In the event any portion of the foregoing conflicts with any other Charlotte County Code or other applicable law, the more restrictive shall apply. If any subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of these sections is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the chapter.

Section 17. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect upon its filing in the office of the Secretary of State, State of Florida.

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## **ECONOMIC IMPACT STATEMENT**

Ordinance Amending the South Charlotte Stormwater Utility Unit

All amendments are administrative in nature; no effect on competition or the local employment market is anticipated.


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# D. Benefits on Implementation:
