


Records Management

Teams have been tasked with developing strategies for harnessing advantages and mitigating risks these alternate futures may present. Melbourne Parcels

In November the Economic Development Office brought a proposal to the Board of County Commissioners from Arciterra to purchase the Melbourne Parcels. Arciterra envisions developing the property in conjunction with Whiskey Joe's with a restaurant, a cabana food/beverage, and dry dock boat storage which is not currently available to the county residents. The development would include several public amenities including vehicular access to Live Oak Point, volley ball court, Riverwalk along the water, and various other attractions. The BoCC agreed to start negotiations with Arciterra. The EDO is excited to see this parcel developed.

Charlotte CARES for Business Recovery Grant Program

The Economic Development Office wrapped up the Charlotte CARES for Business Recovery Grant Program in November. The program awarded 112 Charlotte County small businesses \$1.5 million over three phases.

Sales Tax Approvals

November 2020



The citizens approved the proposed project list for the 2020 sales tax initiative at the November election. The list was compiled of various types of projects including roads, water quality infrastructure, school security and new buildings. Facilities is responsible to manage 11 of the approved 23 projects for four departments. Administration forecasts presenting the project list to the Board in early 2021. The project managers are collecting additional scope data and clarifying the project needs. They will draft request for proposals for both design consultants and construction managers. Upon Administration's approval, the project manager will begin the processing the proposals.

Recent Accomplishments

◆ The Franz Ross Park LED parking lot lighting retrofit construction is substantially complete. This project also included new LED pathway



lighting at the sidewalks leading to the YMCA building.

 All of the concrete pilings were installed for the new Fire Station 10, located on Palm Island.



Forward Progress

 Construction began at the Port Charlotte Beach Sailing Center workshop with the foundation slab complete and concrete



masonry unit (CMU) walls installed.

- External permits for Fire Stations 2 and 5 were submitted and comments received. Internal permits will be submitted in December.
- The Harold Avenue Recreation Center wind retrofit design is in progress with 30 percent plans being created for staff review.
- The new north county Public Works yard has both the design consultants and construction manager at risk under contract. The design team recently applied for the zoning exception with a hearing date scheduled for January 13th.

Notable Happenings

- The Board of County Commissioners approved the new LED sports lighting and poles for Franz Ross Park football field 2. Construction will commence in late January to early February.

Hurricane Season Wraps Up

November marks the end of a record-setting hurricane season. But just to make sure we know who is boss, 2020 threw Tropical Storm Eta at us late in the season. Our EOC staff, which has been extremely busy this year with COVID-19, kept a close eye on Eta as it passed through our area. Thankfully, we only had minor wind damage and localized flooding.

The record-setting hurricane season is an excellent example of why everyone needs to have an emergency plan in place. Your plan should include a basic emergency kit with things like water, food, flashlights, first aid kit, manual can opener, phone chargers, and thanks to COVID-19, personnel protective equipment (PPE). Cooking is the number one cause of home fires and fire injuries. To help bring awareness to this fact, Charlotte County Fire & EMS held a deep-fried turkey demonstration at HQ. If not done correctly, deep-frying a turkey can be

extremely dangerous, causing severe burns and fires. Common mistakes include using too much oil in the pot, letting your oil get

too hot, and adding a wet or partially frozen turkey to the hot oil. If you do any of those things it can lead to disastrous results.





- Loveland Grand Master Lift Station: Loveland Boulevard, from Midas Court to Old Landfill Road will be closed until Feb 26
- El Jobean Septic to Sewer Project: The northbound right lane on State Road 776 from Kerrigan Circle to Wood Duck Road will be closed from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m., Monday, Nov. 30 until Monday, Jan. 11. The northbound sidewalk will also be closed during the duration of the closure.

The Utilities Department reminds motorists to remain alert at all times and to exercise caution when traveling in the vicinity of construction zones.
