Administration

County Projects Finishing this Spring

With the first quarter of 2022 already in the books, the calendar is filling up with many ribbon-cuttings for county projects, including two projects funded by the 2014 and 2020 1% percent local option sales tax extensions approved by voters.

A ribbon-cutting is upcoming for Olean Boulevard in Parkside. The Olean widening is one of the final two projects to be completed with 2014 sales tax funding. The project improves public safety and traffic flow in one of the busiest commercial areas in the county.

The finishing touches are being put on the Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting training facility at the Public Safety Complex west of the

Punta Gorda Airport. Funded with 2020 sales taxes and a state grant, the facility will allow Fire & EMS to meet Federal Aviation Administration certification for specialized training for commercial airlcraft accident response. The training is in high demand across the country, with few facilities capable of providing it. Fire departments around the country are scheduling training at our new facility.

Three new fire stations will be opening in the coming months, including Fire Station 10 on Don Pedro Island, Fire Station 2 in Murdock and Fire Station 5 on Burnt Store Road. Location and design of fire stations are critical to both response times and continuity of operations in the event of severe weather.



Olean Boulevard was widened to five lanes between U.S. 41 and Easy Street. The project was funded with 1% local option sales tax money approved by voters in 2014.





Transit Facility


As we begin to adjust to a post-COVID world, staff and drivers will be heading back to the new Transit Operations Center located at 545 Treasa Blvd. Transit is now minutes away from Murdock Circle, has access to all the main arteries of the County and is adjacent to the JB fuel site which will save our drivers time to provide more trips here in the County.

The facility was designed by Darling Company and the project managers were Gary Burdahl and Wharton Smith. Together they exceeded all expectations in design and functionality. The building and the bus yard design and construction were paid for with 5307 Federal Transit Grants and State Toll Credits, no Local funds have been used.

Dave and Kay had the opportunity to talk to aviation companies that may be interested in expanding to Charlotte County.






Play Ball! Spring Training with the Tampa Bay Rays

Port Charlotte Beach Recreation Center



The new center is approximately 20,000 square feet in size and features three ball rooms (250, 150, and 50 square feet), a large commercial kitchen for community functions, and plenty of office and storage space. If Tier 2 funding becomes available and approved, a new pool project will be added to the park.

With the Board approval and negotiations complete with the design consultant and Construction Manager (CM) at Risk, the March 29th kickoff meeting initiated design of the new recreation center.








Harbor. Negotiations are in progress with the engineering firm, DMK Associates. Inc.

Harry Chapin Mobile Food Bank

After two years of conducting a drive through pantry operations from Harold Park, the Harry Chapin Mobile Food Pantry was moved to the Family Services Center on Gibralter Drive. Residents now have the opportunity to visit the pantry on the first and third Thursdays of each month at from 10:00 am – 11:30am. Each month this pantry serves approximatly 450+ families and distributes between 8-9,000 pounds of fresh vegetables, frozen meats, milk and dry goods.




Remake Learning Days - Cinco De Mayo

Wildfire Prevention

According to the U.S. Department of the Interior, nine out of ten wildfires are caused by humans. That means the majority of fires that threaten lives and property are preventable and we all play an important role in preventing brushfires and protecting property.

March is the time of year when brush fires begin to pick up. We've responded to several brush fires which required a big department response and the assistance of the Department of Forestry. A fire in the west county South Gulf Cove neighborhood burned 42 acres before we were able to contain it. That fire threatened many homes but thankfully we were able to protect them. Unfortunately, one homeowner lost a shed, had pool screen damage, and a window that cracked from the heat of the fire. At least two other homes had melted vinyl fences.

The South Gulf Cove fire required a lot of resources to bring under control. We requested and received help from the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office helicopters, Sarasota County Fire Department, North Port Fire, Englewood Fire, Forestry and Lee County sent an engine strike team which consisted of five fire engines and an officer.

During the dry season be careful with anything that can cause a spark or open flame. In the right condition a small fire will quickly grow out of control. Keep vehicles off dry grass because an exhaust can reach temperatures of 1000+ degrees. Create a defensible

space around your home by clearing and maintaining vegetation up to 25 feet around your home. Remove leaves and debris from gutters regularly so blowing embers can't land in a fuel source and catch your home on fire.





• El Jobean Septic to Sewer Project: Construction of a wastewater system to service approximately 300 properties with sewer service. On-site sewer connections for all phases have started. Residents will receive a door hanger approximately one week before the connection to your home. The project is expected to be finalized this summer.

Ackerman Septic to Sewer Project:

Construction of a wastewater system to service approximately 2,135 properties with sewer service. Zones 1, 2 and the vacuum station are currently underway. Crews are working on the water main replacement throughout the project area. Zone 1 sewer connections are expected to begin this fall. For project information:

- Sewer Lift Station Generator Project: Installation of stationary and mobile generators at our major sewer lift stations throughout the county. This project will allow lift stations to continue operations during storms and events when power is lost. All stationary generators are being installed at the 500-year flood elevation.
- Deep Creek Sewer Force Main Project: Construction of a larger sewer force main to improve transmission capacity for the Deep Creek neighborhood. Crews are working on Phase 2 of the project. Work is occurring along Rio De Janeiro Ave. heading north towards Sandhill Blvd. Project Map
