In the months following Hurricane Ian, Fiscal has worked diligently with departments to identify, track, and log all recovery expenditures. This included validating over 15,800 DDLs. A dashboard using 123Survey and DDL data was created that centralized real time damages and estimated recovery costs. Additionally, Fiscal compiled a damage inventory log for FEMA and worked with Facilities staff to identify what qualifies for insurance recovery vs FEMA reimbursement. In order to recover as much as possible from FEMA, it is imperative that guidelines are followed, and documentation is provided on the front end. Fiscal has helped departments to do this, attending daily meetingsr for six months. Fiscal also set up recurring meetings with Purchasing, Legal, and county departments to ensure all requirements are being met. We will continue to assist the organization through this process.

SUFFOLK CONSTRUCTION NEARS FINISH LINE OF BUILDING SUNSEEKER RESORT

The 785-room Sunseeker Resort Charlotte Harbor is nearing the end of construction, with the last of six cranes on-site scheduled to be removed July 10.

Guest reservations are being accepted for stays beginning Oct. 16. Pete Tuffo, president of the Gulf Coast region for Suffolk Construction and president of the company's national gaming and hospitality division, said about 800 construction workers have been on-site, at least six days a week, for most of the duration of the project. That continues now as construction heads toward the finish line.

The buildings measure a combined 1.4 million square feet, with 60,000 square feet of convention space. There are 20 restaurants on-site. From end to end, it measures about half a mile and is all packed between the harbor and U.S. 41.

PORT CHARLOTTE GETTING A 'DOWNTOWN' PARKSIDE VILLAGE TO CONTAIN HOTEL, APARTMENTS, SHOPS, OFFICES



Charlotte County commissioners approved a zoning change which paves the way for Parkside Village — Port Charlotte's new "downtown."

Development firm JLJI PC, LLC can now proceed with plans to transform the Promenades Mall site at 3280 Tamiami Trail, into a small city containing 791 apartments, 600 hotel rooms and 500,000 square feet of commercial uses.

"Promenades Mall back in the 1970s was the center of town," said Robert Berntsson, an attorney with the Big W Law Firm, who represents the developers.

"Sears was there for those of you who remember, a movie theater, a couple of local bars," he told Charlotte County Commissioners on Tuesday. "That's where you were seen in Port Charlotte in the late 70s in evenings and on weekends." Read more here.

Seagate Development Group's Commercial Division has announced their completion of phases one and two for American Builders and Contractors Supply Co, Inc. – completing and turning the project over to the high-profile company. ABC Supply is the nation's largest wholesale distributor of roofing supplies and one of the largest of siding, windows and other select exterior and interior building products, tools and related supplies.

Phase one, the spacious 60,000-plus sq-ft warehouse at 7000 Commerce Parkway at Airport Drive near the Punta Gorda Airport was completed and turned over two months ago. Besides warehouse space, the structure includes over 6,000 sq-ft of office space, a large customer product showroom, and customer sales and distribution center. Hurricane Season

June is the official beginning of hurricane season which runs through the end of November. As we learned last year, it only takes one big storm for us to be affected in a life-changing way. That is why Public Safety wants you to be prepared. If you do not already have a hurricane plan and emergency kit in place, don't wait. You should also be prepared to heed any warnings our Emergency Management team issues.

Hopefully, you are already prepared and "Know Your Zone." That means you know in which evacuation zone your home is located. It's important because we want you to evacuate if directed by Emergency Management. Often, with a hurricane, the big concern is flooding associated with storm surge. A storm surge can be deadly since most of our county's population is near the water. If asked to evacuate, know where you will go. Shelters should be a last resort. Better options include

friends, family, or hotel rooms located outside the affected area.

Next, you should have your emergency kit in place with enough supplies for seven days. Ensure you have the essentials like food, water (one gallon per person, per day), flashlights, batteries, and extra medications (at least a two week supply). Don't forget to include supplies for any pets. After a storm hits, we will be working to get supplies into the area but it could take several days due to storm damage or other issues, so we say to have a seven-day supply of food, water, and essentials for each family member.

At Public Safety, we test and practice our emergency plans annually just like we ask you to do at home. We always hope our emergency plans and kits are unnecessary and not used but having them in place is essential to being prepared for anyone living in Southwest Florida.


US Amateur Basketball -Boys & Girls State Championship
