I. Welcome – Janette S. Knowlton, County Attorney

Attorney Knowlton thanked everyone for attending, gave a brief overview of Charter Review Commission history, rules, regulations, and procedures.

b. Sunshine and Public Records Law

Attorney Knowlton discussed the following areas: the Sunshine Law, Constitutional Rights, Public Meetings, Non in Person Communication, Meeting Requirements, Minutes, Participation Rule, Recording, Audio or Video, Posted Notices, Penalties, Exemptions, Records Retention, Records Requests, Record Format, Unavailability of Records, Resources, Litigation, and Attorney Client Privilege.

Member Thornberry inquired about procedures for attending other meetings with Charter Members. **Member O'Halloran** spoke to the process for discussions. **Member Abbatematteo** questioned the procedure for communication with Commissioners. **Member Hess** mentioned a past conversation with **Commissioner Constance** regarding Charter related items.

II. Administrative Support – Raymond Sandrock, County Administrator

Raymond Sandrock, County Administrator introduced Kelly Shoemaker, Deputy County Administrator and Hector Flores, Assistant to the County Administrator, advised the contact process to be followed, mentioned the budget process, elaborated on the Administrative Support hiring process, a job description for the position,

mentioned hiring through a temporary employment agency, candidate screening, recommended the Charter Chair interview the Candidate for final selection, and advised what is supplied to the Charter Review Commission for office space and materials. Attorney Knowlton responded to Member inquiries and highly recommended that the first order of business at the next meeting be the selection of an Attorney and an Administrative Support Person. Ms. Shoemaker pointed out that legal assistance will also be available.
