## **Charlotte County Boater Revolving Fund**

## Fiscal Year 2025 Grant Application and Guidelines

### Application Deadline is January 31, 2024

Effective December 15, 2023, applicants may apply for grant assistance from the Boater Revolving Fund revenues collected from boat registration fees, and from the West Coast Inland Navigation District (WCIND) revenues collected from property tax assessments. The Marine Advisory Committee will not accept or consider applications after the deadline.

Who May Apply: Charlotte County government agencies and local not-for-profit organizations may apply for these funds.

**Types of Grant Funding Available:** There are 3 sources of grant funding available. A single application will be submitted and the County will determine what source of funding best fits your application. Some categories of funding require a recipient match. In addition to the following specific criteria, all projects must serve a public purpose and benefit the community as a whole.

- WCIND. Funding for public navigation channels, boating access facilities, waterfront parks, and piers; as well as, marine and environmental education and safety programs. Projects are categorized into 5 groups; marine law enforcement (funded 100%), navigation improvement (funded 100%), environmental education (funded 100%), boater safety/education (50% match required), and boater recreation (50% match required). WCIND funding may not be used for general operations and maintenance.
- **Boater Improvement-State.** Recreational channel marking and other uniform waterway markers, public boat ramps, lifts and hoists, marine railways, public launching facilities, removal of derelict vessels, hazardous floating structures. (funded 100%)
- **Boater Improvement-Local.** Patrol, regulation, and maintenance of the lakes, rivers, and waters, as well as, other boating-related activities. (Up to 100% funding available)

**General Information:** This is a **cost reimbursement** program for projects that will be completed within one fiscal year; which is from **October 1, 2024 to September 30, 2025**. All unspent grant funds remaining at the end of the grant period will be retained by Charlotte County and unobligated. For extenuating circumstances, a project extension may be approved upon written request.

With submittal of the application, all non-government applicants <u>must</u> provide their organization's current Florida Division of Corporations Annual Report. Copies are available at <a href="http://search.sunbiz.org/Inquiry/CorporationSearch/ByName">http://search.sunbiz.org/Inquiry/CorporationSearch/ByName</a>.

If awarded, organizations will be required to sign a funding agreement with Charlotte County Board of County Commissioners (BCC) outlining the obligations of both parties as they relate to the grant. Agencies awarded grant funds will be required to provide **quarterly reports** of project status. Law Enforcement agencies may have additional reporting requirements. Additionally, agencies awarded funds for equipment, goods, or services exceeding \$5,000 in value will be required to provide Charlotte County:

- No less than 3 written bids for approval prior to purchase. If an item or service is determined by the recipient to be available from only one vendor, the recipient may request, in writing, a "sole-source" purchase authorization from Charlotte County.
- An annual report of any equipment's current use and value until the asset value falls below \$5,000.
- A formal request for disposition of equipment if it is no longer used for the purpose grant funds were awarded.

#### **Grant Application Processing Schedule:**

- 12/15/2023 01/31/2024. Application Period. No applications will be accepted or considered after the deadline.
- **February March 2024.** Charlotte County Marine Advisory Committee (MAC) reviews and prioritizes applications for formal recommendation to Board of County Commissioners (BCC).
- April 2024. BCC reviews MAC recommendation and votes on applications.
- July September 2024. Grant contracts developed and signed.
- 10/01/2024. Fiscal Year 2025 Grant term begins.

#### **Application Instructions:**

The name of the applicant's organization must be the legal title of that entity. For non-governmental organizations, it will be the same as provided on the Florida Division of Corporation Annual Report. Ensure the appropriate corporate designation (i.e. LLC, Inc.) is included with the organization's title. Attach the Florida Division of Corporation Annual Report.

For not-for-profit organizations, the Principal Officer identified must be the official who is authorized to legally bind the organization contractually, and whose name is identified as an officer of the organization on the Florida Division of Corporations Annual Report.

Projects for grant funding must fall into at least one of several categories of work. Select the category or categories that best describe your project's scope.

Briefly describe the project on the application and, if desired, attach a detailed description of the project to the application. Descriptions should provide a full scope of the project.

The applicant will indicate the total amount of grant funding requested, as well as, any funds the applicant will contribute towards the project. Not all projects require an applicant to contribute project funds; however, two categories of projects available for grant funding from WCIND require the applicant to pay for 50% of the project; referred to as matching funds. These projects are associated with boater safety and education, and boater recreation. If the applicant is requesting Boater Improvement-Local funding from Charlotte County to fund all, or a portion of, the applicant's required 50% matching funds, provide a statement to justify the request.

Pre-Construction permits, engineering, plans, and specifications must be paid for by the applicant, and should be complete and current at the time of application. Enter the required permits, their status, and expiration. Attach permits, plans, maps, and other related detail to the application.

The applicant must complete the project budget sheet attached to the application. Be sure to fill out all columns of the grant budget to distinguish Grant Funds budgeted and Matching Funds budgeted, if applicable. If the attached budget template is insufficient for your project, the applicant may attach an alternative budget format.
