26	WHEREAS, section 509.233, Fla. Stat., states that "the governing body	of a local
27	government may establish, by ordinance, a local exemption procedure to	o certain
28	provisions of the Food and Drug Administration Food Code to allow patrons' de	ogs within
29	certain designated outdoor portions of public food service establishments"; and	ĺ
30	WHEREAS, the adoption of the local exemption procedure shall be a	t the sole
31	discretion of the governing body of a participating local government but shall k	e subject
32	to the limitations stated in section 509.233(3), Fla. Stat.; and	
33	WHEREAS, the local exemption shall provide for codification within	the land

development code of a participating local government; and

35	WHEREAS, the County shall have such powers as are reasonably necessary to
36	regulate and enforce the local exemption pursuant to section 509.233(4), Fla. Stat.
37	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners
38	of Charlotte County, Florida, that:
39	Section 1. Article VIII, of the Code of Laws and Ordinances of Charlotte County,
40	Florida, shall be created as follows (underlined words are inserted, words that are struck
41	through are deleted):
42	Article VIII. Dogs in Designated Areas of Food Service Establishments.
43	Section 3-5-206. Definitions.
44	In this Article, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings indicated. Except
45	as defined herein, all other words used in this Article shall have their customary dictionary
46	definitions.
47	Department: The Charlotte County Community Development Department, or its
48	successor.
49	Division: The Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation,
50	Division of Hotels and Restaurants, or its successor.
51	Employee: Employee or Employees shall include, but is not limited to, the owner
52	or owners of the Food Service Establishment.
53	Food Service Establishment: Food Service Establishment is defined in Section
54	2-3-21, of the Code of Laws and Ordinances of Charlotte County, Florida.
55	Section 3-5-207. Requirements of Food Service Establishments Which Allow Dogs.
56	(a) Food Service Establishments that have received a permit pursuant to this Article are
57	exempt from those sections of the Food and Drug Administration Food Code that prohibit

58	live animals in Food Service Establishments.
59	(b) No dog shall be in a Food Service Establishment unless allowed by state law and the
60	Food Service Establishment has received and maintains an unexpired permit pursuant to
61	this Article allowing dogs in designated outdoor areas of the establishment.
62	(c) Food Service Establishments must apply for and receive a permit from the Department
63	before patrons' dogs are allowed on the premises. The Board of County Commissioners
64	of Charlotte County, Florida ("Board") shall adopt by resolution a reasonable fee to pay
65	for the cost of processing the initial application, permitting, inspections, renewals, and
66	enforcement. The application for a permit shall require the following information:
67	(1) Name, location, mailing address and Division-issued license number of the
68	Food Service Establishment.
69	(2) Title, name, mailing address, and telephone contact information of the permit
70	applicant. Applications are accepted from only the owner of the Food Service
71	Establishment or the owner's authorized agent, which authorization must be in
72	writing and notarized. The Food Service Establishment shall also provide the
73	name, mailing address, and telephone contact information of the owner to the
74	Department if the owner is not the permit applicant.
75	(3) A diagram and description of the outdoor area which is requested to be
76	designated as available to patrons' dogs, including:
77	i. dimensions of the designated area;
78	ii. a depiction of the number and placement of tables, chairs, and restaurant
79	equipment, if any; the entryways and exits to the designated outdoor area;
80	iii. the boundaries of the designated area and of the other outdoor dining areas

81	not available for patrons' dogs;
82	iv. any fences or other barriers; and
83	v. surrounding and adjacent property lines and public rights-of-way, including
84	sidewalks and common pathways.
85	(4) The diagram referenced in subsection (3) above shall be accurate and to scale
86	but need not be prepared by a licensed design professional. A copy of the
87	approved diagram shall be attached to the permit.
88	(5) A list of the days of the week and hours of operation that patrons' dogs will be
89	permitted in the designated outdoor area of the Food Service Establishment.
90	(d) Food Service Establishments that receive a permit to allow dogs in a designated
91	outdoor area pursuant to this Article shall require that:
92	(1) Employees shall wash their hands promptly after touching, petting, or otherwise
93	handling any dog.
94	(2) Employees shall be prohibited from touching, petting, or otherwise handling
95	any dog while serving food or beverages or handling tableware or before entering
96	other parts of the Food Service Establishment.
97	(3) Patrons in a designated outdoor area shall be advised by appropriate signage,
98	at conspicuous locations, that they should wash their hands before eating and
99	waterless hand sanitizer be provided at all tables in the designated outdoor area.
100	(4) Patrons keep their dogs under control and on a leash at all times.
101	(5) Employees and patrons shall not allow dogs to come into contact with serving
102	dishes, utensils, tableware, linens, paper products, or any other items involved with
103	food service operations.

104	(6) Employees and patrons shall not allow any part of a dog to be on chairs, tables,
105	or other furnishings.
106	(7) Employees shall clean and sanitize all table and chair surfaces with an
107	approved product between seating of patrons.
108	(8) Employees shall remove all dropped food and spilled drink from the floor or
109	ground as soon as possible but in no event less frequently than between seating
110	of patrons at the nearest table.
111	(9) Employees and patrons shall remove all dog waste immediately and the floor
112	or ground be immediately cleaned and sanitized with an approved product.
113	Employees shall keep a kit with the appropriate materials for this purpose near the
114	designated outdoor area.
115	(10) Employees and patrons shall not permit dogs to be in, or to travel through,
116	indoor or non-designated outdoor portions of the Food Service Establishment.
117	(11) At all times while the designated outdoor portion of the Food Service
118	Establishment is available to patrons and their dogs, at least one sign shall be
119	posted in a conspicuous and public location near the entrance to the designated
120	outdoor portion of the Food Service Establishment, notifying patrons that the
121	designated outdoor portion of the Food Service Establishment is currently
122	available to patrons accompanied by their dog or dogs. The mandatory sign shall
123	be not less than eight and one-half inches in width and 11 inches in height (8½ x
124	11) and printed in easily legible typeface of not less than 20-point font size.
125	(12) At least one sign reminding patrons of the applicable rules, including those
126	contained in this part, and any permit conditions, which may be imposed by the

127	Department, shall be posted in a conspicuous location within the designated
128	outdoor portion of the Food Service Establishment. The mandatory sign shall be
129	not less than eight and one-half inches in width and 11 inches in height (8½ x 11)
130	and printed in easily legible typeface of not less than 20-point font size.
131	(13) At least one sign reminding employees of the applicable rules, including those
132	contained in this part, and any permit conditions, which may be imposed by the
133	Department, shall be posted in a conspicuous location frequented by employees
134	within the Food Service Establishment. The mandatory sign shall be not less than
135	eight and one-half inches in width and 11 inches in height (8½ x 11) and printed in
136	easily legible typeface of not less than 20-point font size.
137	(14) Ingress and egress to the designated outdoor area shall not require entrance
138	into or passage through any indoor area or non-designated outdoor portions of the
139	Food Service Establishment.
140	(15) The Food Service Establishment and designated outdoor area shall comply
141	with all permit conditions and the approved diagram.
142	(16) Employees and patrons shall not allow any dog to be in the designated
143	outdoor areas of the Food Service Establishment if the Food Service
144	Establishment is in violation of any of the requirements of this Article.
145	(17) Permits shall be conspicuously displayed in the designated outdoor area.
146	(e) A permit issued pursuant to this Article shall expire automatically upon the sale of the
147	Food Service Establishment and cannot be transferred to a subsequent owner. The
148	subsequent owner may apply for a permit pursuant to this Article if the subsequent owner
149	wishes to continue to allow patrons' dogs in a designated outdoor area of the Food

150	Service Establishment. Permits shall expire on June 30 of each year.
151	Section 3-5-208. Complaints and Reporting.
152	(a) Complaints may be made in writing to the Department. The Department shall accept,
153	document, and respond to all complaints and shall timely report to the Division all
154	complaints and the response to such complaints.
155	(b) The Department shall provide the Division with a copy of all approved applications
156	and permits issued.
157	(c) All applications, permits, and other related materials shall contain the Division issued
158	license number for the Food Service Establishment.
159	Section 3-5-209. Enforcement and Penalties.
160	(a) It shall be unlawful to fail to comply with any of the requirements of this Article. Each
161	instance of a dog on the premises of a Food Service Establishment that does not have a
162	valid permit authorizing dogs at the Food Service Establishment is a separate violation.
163	(b) It shall be the responsibility of the Department to enforce the provisions of this Article
164	within Charlotte County.
165	(c) A permit may be revoked by the Department if, after notice and reasonable time in
166	which the grounds for revocation may be corrected as specified in the notice, the Food
167	Service Establishment fails to comply with any condition of the permit, fails to comply with
168	the approved diagram, fails to maintain any required state or local license, or is found to
169	be in violation of any provision of this Article. If the ground for revocation is a failure to
170	maintain any required state or local license, the revocation may take effect immediately
171	upon giving notice of revocation to the permit holder.
172	(d) If a Food Service Establishment's permit for allowing dogs at the Food Service

173	Establishment is revoked, no new permit may be approved for the Food Service
174	Establishment until the expiration of 180 days following the date of revocation.
175	(e) Any Food Service Establishment that fails to comply with the requirements of this
176	Article shall be guilty of violating this part of the Charlotte County Code of Laws and
177	Ordinances and shall be subject to any and all enforcement proceedings consistent with
178	the Code of Laws and Ordinances of Charlotte County, Florida and general law. Each
179	day a violation exists shall constitute a distinct and separate offense.
180	(f) This Article shall not apply to the use of dogs as service animals under federal or state
181	<u>law.</u>
182	Section 2. Conflict with Other Ordinances. The provisions of this Ordinance
183	shall supersede any provision of existing ordinances in conflict herewith to the extent of
184	said conflict.
185	Section 3. Severability. If any section, subsection, clause, phrase, or provision of
186	this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent
187	jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision
188	and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance.
189	Section 4. Effective Date. A certified copy of this Ordinance shall be filed with the
190	Department of State of the State of Florida within 10 days of enactment and shall take
191	effect upon filing with said department.
