

“Buster”

In June 2024, our department received a call in regards to dogs that were constantly running at large, with one being injured due to being hit by a car 2 weeks prior. Animal Control Officer Beattie located the dog “Buster” on the property, who appeared to have an obvious broken leg. The dog was immediately impounded and transported to a local veterinarian. There, it was confirmed that the leg was severely fractured, which appeared to be trying to heal but was unable to due to the distance between the bones. The owners admitted that they did minimum veterinary care after he was hit by the car, but they could not afford the surgery to fix his leg. The owner eventually agreed to surrender Buster to our department. Buster’s leg was amputated, and he was adopted into a loving home.

“Kodak”

Kodak was surrendered to our department in September 2024 after the owner failed to provide proper care. Kodak suffered from an extreme case of luxating patellas, which means the kneecaps slide out of their normal position when the knee is flexed. Kodak was taken to an orthopedic surgeon, where the patella was corrected and pinned.
