A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CHARLOTTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, DECLARING AN END TO THE BURN BAN AND REPEALING RESOLUTION 2022-035.

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the Charlotte County Board of County Commissioners ("the Board") enacted Ordinance 2018-016 ("the Ordinance") which provides the Board with authority to adopt a Resolution declaring a drought emergency and extreme risk of wild fires and imposing certain restrictions on activities that can cause wild fires and to repeal, amend or modify such Resolution when conditions change; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Chief for Charlotte County has advised that the potential for extreme fire behavior resulting from drought conditions in Charlotte County has receded; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Chief has recommended the lifting of the restrictions and prohibitions imposed on April 5, 2022; and

WHEREAS, after considering the recommendation of the Fire Chief, the Board has determined it to be in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare to adopt this resolution declaring an end to the prior burn ban and lifting all of restrictions and prohibitions on open burning and discharge of fireworks or incendiary devices in Charlotte County, which were imposed on April 5, 2022.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Charlotte County, Florida:

Section 1. Pursuant to Charlotte County Ordinance 2018-016, and upon the



recommendation of the Fire Chief, the Board hereby lifts the ban on all outdoor burning (including yard waste, recreational fires and pile burning for land clearing), and on the private use and discharge of fireworks and sparklers and all other restrictions imposed under the April 5, 2022 fire ban. Likewise, the Board hereby repeals in its entirety, Resolution 2022-035.

Section 2. A summary of this Resolution shall be published twice, in a quarter page advertisement in a newspaper of general circulation in Charlotte County, with the second advertisement appearing no more than five (5) days after publication of the first advertisement.

Section 3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
