Call to Order/Roll Call:

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. A roll call was taken, and a quorum was present.

Changes to the Agenda / Motion to Approve Changes:

Citizen Input on Agenda Items (3 Minute Limit):

 Rick Pelenske expressed his concern on placing dredge material on or near the Gulf Cove Association Property Owner Association (POA) property and if it were approved, he recommends compensation for the POA.

Approval of Minutes:

The minutes from December 2, 2022, were unanimously approved as written.

Unfinished Business:

a) Interior Dredge-Bathymetric Survey Design: Mr. Patchell explained he has asked Parks and Recreation to utilize the park property at 13008 Gallagher Boulevard and they have declined. He explained the dredge material must go somewhere and helping secure a location for the contractor would help project cost and there could be a benefit to the private property owner for utilization of the property. It is required the contractor would remove all material and the property to be restored. He stated that design and construction dredge projects have been delayed due to the hurricane event, and it is the intent of county staff to apply for FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) grant funding. Mr. Wernicke inquired on canal debris and washout materials in relation to material in waterways. Mr. Patchell stated the debris canal clean-up is a state contractor managed by the Florida Department of Emergency Management (FDEM), however, they are in West County currently. Mr. Patchell explained projects to repair washouts are being put out to bid for contracted work by Public Works Engineering.

New Business:

a) <u>Financial Reports</u>: The fiscal year (FY) 2023 quarter one actual expenditure, FY22 annual actual expenditure and the preliminary FY24/25 preliminary budgets reports were provided for review; there was discussion on the new activity reports. Mr. Wernicke recommended having the history of the rate still included on the new style of budgets and it was unanimously agreed. Mr. Demere motioned to approve the FY24/25 preliminary budget, seconded by Ms. Draus and it was unanimously approved.

Citizen Input on MSBU Items (3 Minute Limit):

- Paul Schamberger explained a washout on his property, 3120 Paar Circle along the seawall going into the canal, he recommended a pipe to be installed that leads the water out into the canal.
- Jon Patty pointed out the washout that occurred on Quail Terrace.

 Ms. Kelley asked the citizens to stay after the meeting adjourned, and she would review the areas as it was not in the purview of this waterway MSBU.

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. A roll call was taken, and a quorum was present.

Approval of Minutes:

The minutes from May 11, 2022, were unanimously approved as written.

Unfinished Business:

a) <u>Interior Dredge-Bathymetric Survey Design:</u> Mr. Patchell explained the sediment that has come into the waterways from Hurricane Ian has been evaluated. He inquired if the property owners' association representative would consider discussing a parcel near their park for sediment to be placed and hauled away for the future dredge project, noting a cost savings to the citizens of the waterways.

New Business:

- a) Financial Reports: The fiscal year (FY) 2022 quarter four actual expenditure, activity maintenance and the adopted FY23 budgets reports were provided for review; there was discussion on the upcoming FY24/25 budgets, and new activity reports. Mr. Wernicke inquired on lowering the assessment rate due to FEMA reimbursement. Mr. Patchell stated that it is the intent to apply and receive FEMA reimbursement; Ms. Kelley advised it would not be recommended to lower the rate until grant funding is received and at that time a request to Fiscal could be submitted.
- b) Post Storm Survey: Mr. Patchell explained the hurricane waterway debris contract. He stated that the post-storm survey has been sent to purchasing to go out for bid, and staff is seeking reimbursement by FEMA as there was a pre-storm survey completed. Wash outs that occurred were discussed. He explained the intent would be to do an exterior dredge at the same time of the interior dredge to save on costs for the sediment that was caused by Hurricane Ian.
