ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CHARLOTTE COUNTY, FLORIDA AMENDING CHAPTER 4-1, ARTICLE II, SECTION 4-1-17 OF THE CODE OF LAWS AND ORDINANCES OF CHARLOTTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, "MSBU/TU ADVISORY BOARDS MEMBERSHIP" BY ADDING PROVISIONS TO CLARIFY THE TERMS OF OFFICE FOR EXISTING ADVISORY BOARD MEMBERS; AMENDING CHAPTER 4-6, ARTICLE VIII BY CREATING A NEW SECTION 4-6-143 THAT ESTABLISHES AN ADVISORY BOARD FOR THE ROTONDA HEIGHTS STREET AND DRAINAGE UNIT MSBU: AMENDING CHAPTER 4-6, ARTICLE XXXV BY CREATING A NEW SECTION 4-6-738 THAT ESTABLISHES AN ADVISORY BOARD FOR THE ROTONDA SANDS STREET AND DRAINAGE UNIT MSBU: PROVIDING SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, The Charlotte County Board of County Commissioners (hereinafter "Board") adopted Ordinance Number 2015-045 to provide for consistency and continuity among all MSBU/MSTU advisory boards; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to amend that Ordinance to clarify the terms of office for all MSBU/MSTU advisory boards; and

WHEREAS, the Board has received Petitions requesting establishment of two new advisory boards, one for the Rotonda Heights Street & Drainage MSBU and one for the Rotonda Sands Street & Drainage MSBU; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to establish advisory boards for the Rotonda Heights Street & Drainage MSBU and the Rotonda Sands Street & Drainage MSBU.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CHARLOTTE COUNTY, FLORIDA AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 4-1-17 of the Code of Laws and Ordinances of Charlotte County, Florida is hereby amended as follows (underlined sections are additions and strikethrough sections are deletions):

Sec. 4-1-17. - Membership.

For each unit, the board of advisors shall consist of five (5) members (hereinafter, collectively "members") appointed by the board. All members shall be residents and owners of real property within the unit. The criteria for selection of members shall include, among other things, technical knowledge or expertise in matters related to the work program of the unit or demonstrated interest in community service.

For newly created advisory boards to a new or existing unit, continuity of membership shall be established with the initial terms of office being drawn by lot as follows: One (1) member shall be appointed for one (1) year, two (2) members shall be appointed for two (2) years, and two (2) members shall be appointed for three (3) years. After the initial term, members shall serve a term of three (3) years and all members shall be eligible for reappointment to the board of advisors. All terms of office for newly created advisory boards shall commence on November 1 and terminate on October 31.

For existing advisory boards, continuity of membership shall be maintained through appointing new members or reappointing members for a period of three (3) years to be consistent with the date establishing the advisory board as follows: The current term of office for all members serving on an advisory board on November 1, 2016 shall terminate and such members shall be immediately reappointed to a new term of office that commences on November 1, 2016. In order to stagger the terms of office thereafter, such reappointed members' term length shall be determined by lot at the first meeting of the advisory board held after November 1, 2016, with one member being appointed for a one (1) year term, two (2) members being appointed for two (2) year terms and two (2) members being appointed for three (3) year terms. Members appointed to fill a vacancy with less than six (6) months to the end of term date shall be appointed for the remainder of the term and the following three-year term. Members appointed to fill a vacancy with a remaining term of more than six (6) months shall fill the remainder of the vacant term.

<u>Section 2</u>. Section 4-6-143 of the Code of Laws and Ordinances of Charlotte County, Florida is hereby created as follows:

Sec. 4-6-143. Establishment of Advisory Board.

The Board of County Commissioners hereby establishes a Board of Advisors for the Rotonda Heights Street and Drainage Unit adhering to Sections 4-1-16—4-1-23, in Article II, Chapter 4-1 of the Code of Laws and Ordinances of Charlotte County, Florida.

<u>Section 3.</u> Section 4-6-738 of the Code of Laws and Ordinances of Charlotte County, Florida is hereby created as follows:

Sec. 4-6-738. Establishment of Advisory Board.

The Board of County Commissioners hereby establishes a Board of Advisors for the Rotonda Sands Street and Drainage Unit adhering to Sections 4-1-16—4-1-23, in Article II, Chapter 4-1 of the Code of Laws and Ordinances of Charlotte County, Florida.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or applications. To this end, the provisions of this ordinance are declared severable.

Section 5. Effective Date. A certified copy of this Ordinance shall be filed with the Department of State of the State of Florida within 10 days of enactment and shall take effect upon filing with said department.
