## County launches disaster recovery projects dashboard

Charlotte County launched a new Disaster Recovery Projects Dashboard feature on its website today. The feature can be reached at <a href="https://www.charlottecountyfl.gov/disasterprojects">www.charlottecountyfl.gov/disasterprojects</a> or by clicking the dashboard graphic on the website homepage.

The feature includes a dashboard containing the more than 1,200 recovery projects county staff and contractors have completed, are currently working on or will be working on in the future. There is a map that enables users to find projects by location. A project list is also searchable by project name. The dashboard contains funding sources and amounts, descriptions of the working being done and which storm event caused the damage to the facility or amenity.

The total cost of the debris removal and project repairs is estimated to exceed \$190 million from the five named storms that have impacted Charlotte County since 2022. The county is still awaiting funding from FEMA for many of the projects, but the County Commission has directed staff to begin working on a number of prominent projects using money from our hurricane reserve fund to get those facilities and amenities open.

We reached a milestone on Wednesday when the full parking lot at Englewood Beach reopened. The dashboard details the cost and work completed to reopen the parking lot, remove the damaged boardwalk and install safety fencing. It also covers the sand sifting operation run by the Public Works Department to move and sift thousands of cubic yards so it could be put back onto the beach.

The dashboard will be updated in real time as it draws data from databases tracking funding and project status. This will be a very useful tool for residents to track the progress of their favorite parks and amenities.
