# **Administration**

# Monthly reports highlight county growth, progress

With all that is going on in Charlotte County and within county government, our monthly department reports to be a great source of information. For example, we know our commercial and residential growth is surging. The Community Development Department reported in May 2024 that it issued 394 single-family residential permits and 379 certificates of occupancy, meaning homes ready to be lived in. We also issued nearly 4,000 permits of all types in May.

Two of the booming developments driving that growth are Babcock Ranch, which has been issued 2,765 COs since home construction began in 2016, and West Port, which has received 419 COs since April 2021. In May, Babcock Ranch builders applied for 98 new permits and West Port 46.

On the commercial side, Balentine Builder Services, a Fort Myers-based customer cabinetry business is building a 65,000-sq.-ft. facility that will open this year. A new Mazda dealership on U.S. 41 in Port Charlotte was recently completed and is now open. The Economic Development Office forecasts commercial development valued at \$150 million will be added to the tax rolls in 2024,

rising to \$185 million in 2025 and \$285 million in 2026.

Our growth also means we need more staff to serve and capacity to accommodate them in the Emergency Operations Center before, during and after disasters. We learned during Hurricane Ian that the EOC, which was built after Hurricane Charley damaged the former EOC, needed to be expanded to handle our storm response. We need more meeting rooms, sleeping quarters, food preparation equipment and space, utilities improvements and more. On May 28, the County Commission approved an architectural contract for the design of the EOC expansion. The Florida Legislature approved a \$12 million grant for the project in 2023.

Tourism is booming, too. In May 2024, tourism development tax collections, which are assessed on short-term stays under six months at hotels, home and condo rentals, rose 14.3% from last May to \$726,194. Year over year in May, TDT revenues increased 14.6% to \$5,911,547. Revenue from visitors to Charlotte County, which also includes sales tax collections, saved county residents more than \$1,000 a year on their property taxes.



# County breaks ground on sales tax projects for elections and sheriff

On June 4, county commissioners and officials from the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office and Supervisor of Elections Office participated in grondbreaking ceremonies for the new sheriff's office adminstrative facility and the supervisor's warehouse. The sheriff's facility will house the department's administration, including senior command and support staff units. It also will include a command vehicle garage, and public safety answering point backup. The supervisor's 20,000 sq.

ft. facility will provide a climate-controlled storage area for sensitive polling equipment and related supplies and support staff. The building will also be used by the Facilities Department, sheriff's office and Emergency Management.


Construction on the CCSO building is project to be September 2025 The SOE building is projected to be completed in February 2026

Both projects are being funded with 1% local option sales tax.



The Charlotte County Airport Authority has approved a land lease agreement with NAS MRO Services LLC, a Miami-area firm, to construct a state-of-the-art hangar at Punta Gorda Airport. This new 100,000 square foot hangar will be large enough to accommodate three narrow-body commercial jets for maintenance and repairs. NAS MRO Services LLC can now move forward with the application, permitting, and construction phases, thanks to the CCAA's approval on June 20. Choosing Punta Gorda for their first airside maintenance and repair overhaul facility was influenced by the presence of the Aviation Maintenance School at the airport and the tremendous opportunities awaiting PGD according to Nestor Camacho, Director of Operations and

### **CCSO Admin & SOE Groundbreakings**

The groundbreakings for both the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office Admin Building and the Supervisor of Elections Warehouse were held on June 4, 2024.




The Sheriff's Office Administration & 911 Hardened Facility will house administration offices for senior command, support staff units, command vehicle garage, public safety answering point backup, and a real-time information center.





The Supervisor of Elections Warehouse will be a 20,000 sf climate-controlled storage facility for sensitive polling equipment and supplies. This warehouse will replace the old Airport Road site and will also provide space for CCSO, Facilities, and Emergency Management.

- Cement block work on the 20,000 sf Charlotte County Sheriff's Office District 4 has been completed and site utility work is underway.
- Interior work and new roof installation at the Charlotte County Event Center is completed.
- All punch list items for the Harold Avenue Building Mitigation project have been completed. Only engineer and state signoff remain.
- Two generators at the end of their lifecycle were replaced in the chiller building on the Murdock Administration campus. Generators were replaced with increased capacity units eliminating the need for the rooftop generator which was vulnerable to storm damage.

















# **Public Safety**









### **Hurricane Season**

June is the official beginning of hurricane season which runs through the end of November. As we learned last year, it only takes one big storm for us to be affected in a life-changing way. That is why Public Safety wants you to be prepared. If you do not already have a hurricane plan and emergency kit in place, don't wait. You should also be prepared to heed any warnings our Emergency Management team issues.

Hopefully, you are already prepared and "Know Your Zone." That means you know in which evacuation zone your home is located. It's important because we want you to evacuate if directed by Emergency Management. Often, with a hurricane, the big concern is flooding associated with storm surge. A storm surge can be deadly since most of our county's population is near the water. If asked to evacuate, know where you will go. Shelters should be a last resort. Better options include

friends, family, or hotel rooms located outside the affected area.

Next, you should have your emergency kit in place with enough supplies for seven days. Ensure you have the essentials like food, water (one gallon per person, per day), flashlights, batteries, and extra medications (at least a two week supply). Don't forget to include supplies for any pets. After a storm hits, we will be working to get supplies into the area but it could take several days due to storm damage or other issues, so we say to have a seven-day supply of food, water, and essentials for each family member.

At Public Safety, we test and practice our emergency plans annually just like we ask you to do at home. We always hope our emergency plans and kits are unnecessary and not used but having them in place is essential to being prepared for anyone living in Southwest Florida.

# UNDER CONSTRUCTION

### Ackerman Septic to Sewer Project:

Construction of a wastewater system to service approximately 2,135 properties with sewer service is underway. Zones 1 and 2 and the vacuum station are operating, and Zones 1 and 2 sewer connections have begun.

### Hillsborough Boulevard 8-inch Water Main Project:

This project is installing an 8-inch water main along Hillsborough Boulevard from Yorkshire St. to US 41. The water main will be installed parallel to the Peace River Manasota Water Authority's 42-inch Phase 2B Pipeline. Construction of the 8-inch water main is underway.

# East Port Water Reclamation Facility Expansion

This project includes expanding the current water reclamation facility to treat six million gallons of wastewater per day to nine million gallons per day. The project also includes advanced wastewater treatment, which is a valuable addition to the treatment process to ensure treated water has as low concentrations of nutrients as possible. Construction is underway.
