

## **Commission presented with population growth forecast**

Charlotte County's growth forecasting consultant presented its most recent market data to the County Commission during Tuesday's board meeting. The consultant reported that Charlotte County's population grew 5.5% from 212,424 residents in April 2024 to 224,147 in

projected to be Babcock Ranch, which is expected the add about 4,100 new units and Mid-County, which is expected to add 4,400 units. Many of the Mid-County units will be in the area between U.S.

February 2025. Going back to June 2023, the county population has grown 11% through February 2025. Over the next five years, the consultant forecast the population to reach 256,891, up 31.1% or 61,002 from 195,889. The county's

historic annual growth since 1990 has ranged from 1.3% to 2.8%.

Since June 2023, Charlotte County has added 10,994 new housing units. Between 2025 and 2030, there is a forecast increase of approximate41 and State Road 776, including the new development of West Port in the Murdock Village Redevelopment Area. Since 2024, the West Port area and Babcock Ranch have accounted for 82% of all residential construction.



#### Current Plat Applications in Review

#### PFP-25-04 Sabal Glen (fka Sabal Glen FKA PP-24-07 Village 2 - Tract 1)


Lennar Homes, L.L.C. is requesting Preliminary and Final Plat approval for a subdivision to be named, Sabal Glen, formerly known as Village 2 - Tract 1, being a replat of Tract E-45, of Midtown at Babcock Ranch. The proposed subdivision consists of 220 lots and 10 tracts for roadway, drainage, and open space. They also seek approval of a Developer's Agreement and surety to cover the construction of the plat infrastructure. The site contains 58.0± acres and is within the boundary of the Babcock Ranch Community Development of Regional Impact (DRI) Increment 2, the East County area, and in Commission District I.

#### PFP-25-05 Turnleaf Phase 1A

Burnt Store Developers LLC is requesting Preliminary and Final Plat approval for a subdivision to be named, Turnleaf Phase 1A, being a replat of a portion of Tract R and all of Tract F-1, Tract O-3, and Lot 135 as recorded in Turnleaf Phase 1 and consisting of 24 residential lots and four tracts. The replat is being requested to reconfigure and add lots within the existing Phase 1 boundary. They also seek approval of the First Amendment to the Developer's Agreement. This site contains 123.14± acres and is within the boundary of the Burnt Store Area Plan area, the Coral Creek Community Development District, in Commission District II.

#### William R. Gaines Jr Kayak Launch



#### **Emergency Management:**


The Charlotte County Hurricane Ian Seawall Repair Assistance Program is currently accepting applications for reimbursement of up to 50% of eligible costs incurred by homeowners who paid to repair or replace their seawalls damaged by Hurricane Ian. The program has remaining funds that must be expended by June 30, 2025, and applications will be accepted through May 30. While there are no income restrictions, the property must be homesteaded to qualify. Reimbursements are issued on a first-eligible, first-served basis and will continue until funds are depleted or the deadline is reached. #### Fire & EMS:


Our Marine Operations team competed in the First Responders Dive Challenge, earning top honors and demonstrating the excellence they bring both in competition and in service to the community. The team took 1st place in the Batson's Revenge Challenge and Firemedic Brandon Hurley earned the coveted "Top Frog" title with a 1st place individual finish. Additional top 10 finishes included Firemedic Davey Nelson in 3rd, Deputy Chief Matthew McElroy in 5th, and Firefighter/EMT John Estill Jr. in 6th place. Overall, the team secured an impressive 3rd place in the entire competition.

#### Animal Control:

In April, the Animal Control Division was honored with two official proclamations during the County Commission meeting. The first recognized April 13–19 as Animal Control Officer Week in Charlotte County, highlighting the team's efforts to protect both residents and animals through compassionate response, public education, and enforcement of animal-related laws. The second proclamation declared the same week as Dog Bite Prevention Week, underscoring the importance of education in reducing incidents and promoting community safety. With 456 animal bites reported in 2024 alone, this awareness is more critical than ever. We extend our sincere thanks to the Animal Control Division for their continued dedication and service.


#### March 2025:

## Ackerman Septic to Sewer Project:

Construction of a wastewater system to service approximately 2,135 properties with sewer service is underway. Zones 1 and 2 and the vacuum station are complete, and Zones 1 and 2 sewer connections are underway. Construction for Zones 3, 4 and LPS is expected to start in the summer. AckermanProject.com

## Hillsborough Boulevard 8-inch Water Main Project:

This project is installing an 8-inch water main along Hillsborough Boulevard from Yorkshire St. to US 41. The water main will be installed parallel to the Peace River Manasota Water Authority's 42-inch Phase 28 Pipeline. Construction of the 8-inch water main is underway. The Utilities Department reminds motorists to always remain alert and to exercise caution when traveling near construction zones.

## East Port Water Reclamation Facility Expansion

This project includes expanding the current water reclamation facility to treat six million gallons of wastewater per day to nine million gallons per day. The project also includes advanced wastewater treatment, which is a valuable addition to the treatment process to ensure treated water has as low concentrations of nutrients as possible. Construction is 40% complete.
