100s attend reopening of Mid-County Regional Library

Hundreds of people attended a celebration at the Mid-County Regional Library in Port Charlotte on May 11 to mark the reopening of the hurricane-damaged facility.

In his remarks to the crowd, Charlotte County Commission Chairman Joe Tiseo said, “The Mid-County Regional Library faced significant challenges following Hurricane Ian. Extensive water intrusion impact-

ed much of this facility. But from that adversity, something remarkable has emerged — a stronger, more resilient library that better serves our community.”

The repairs and interior improvements cost \$6.9 million. Construction began in January 2025 and was successfully completed in January 2026. Libraries and History staff performed a massive restocking of materi-

als and equipment to prepare for the public. Insurance covered the mitigation and repair costs and FEMA provided funding to reimburse the county for insurance deductibles.

The library has nine new HVAC units and a brand-new roof. The structure was sealed and repainted and has new furniture, shelving, upgraded infrastructure, and enhanced life safety systems.



The Charlotte County Commission in May held groundbreaking ceremonies for three 1% local option sales tax projects, two new fire stations and improvements to the William R. Gaines Jr., Veterans Memorial Park.

County launches 1% local option sales tax outreach initiatives

Charlotte County launched a series of outreach initiatives to educate voters about the referendum the County Commission voted to place on the Nov. 3 ballot to extend the 1% local option sales tax for 20 years.

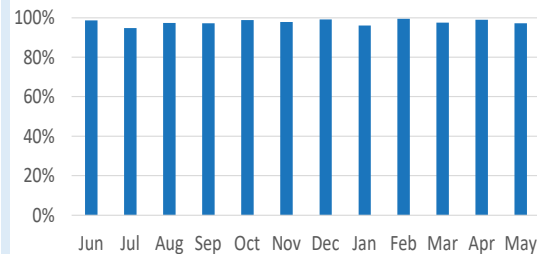

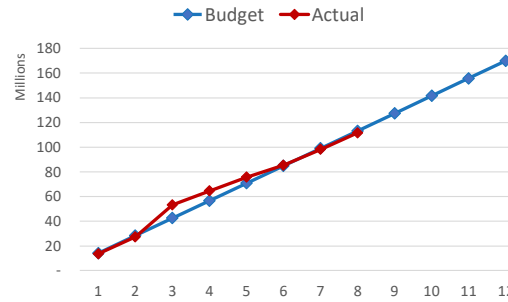

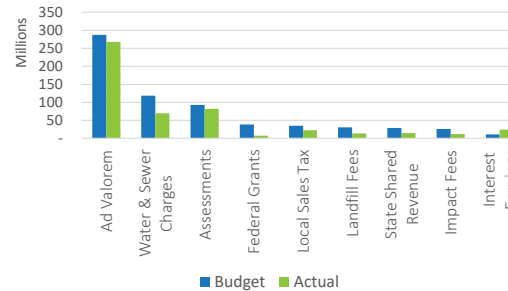

Major Revenue Sources



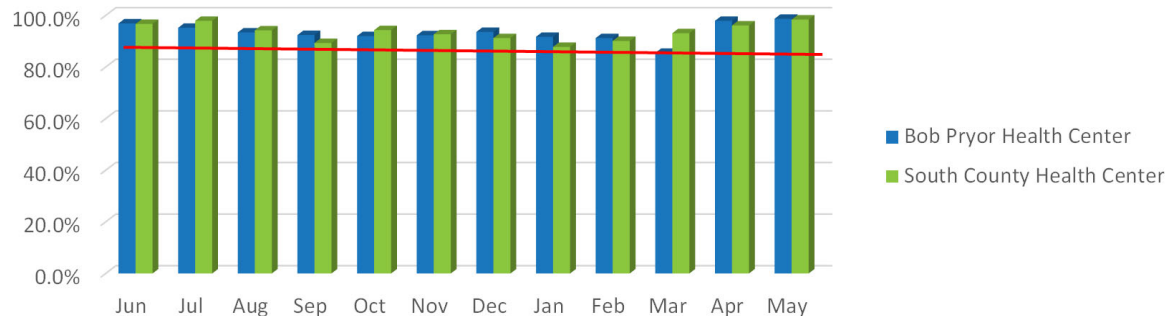

Emergency Management

This month focused on hurricane season readiness, community preparedness, and strengthening operational coordination. Staff advanced key planning initiatives while supporting training, exercises, and recovery efforts that enhance the county's overall preparedness and resilience.

Training & Exercise Activities

The department conducted the Annual HURREX Exercise with 139 participants and participated in a FDACS exercise focused on Points of Distribution (PODs) and feeding operations. Staff also hosted WEBEOC training, conducted CERT Basic Training, and completed facility walkthroughs to support hurricane season readiness.

Community Outreach & Preparedness

Emergency Management continued community outreach and preparedness efforts, delivering hurricane preparedness presentations to approximately 2,450 residents through events including the Annual Expo and Englewood Expo. Staff also conducted CPR/AED training, supported shelter training initiatives, completed approximately two-thirds of Special Needs Program calls, and provided hurricane season and strategic planning updates to the Board of County Commissioners.

Operations & Coordination

Emergency Management supported warehouse transition operations, including the movement of 29 pallets, while continuing shelter preparedness efforts. Staff also participated in numerous local, regional, and statewide coordination meetings to strengthen partnerships and maintain readiness including the Florida Domestic Security Coordinating Group Executive Board Meeting.

Planning, Recovery & Readiness

Recovery staff continued coordination with stakeholders to formalize recovery processes and support long-term planning efforts. The Mass Casualty Incident Plan entered the final draft stage, the Debris Management Plan advanced toward legal review, and the Storm Surge Visualization Project continued to progress.

Program Updates & Recognition

Staff continued updates to the county's Transit and Fuel Plans. During the month, Ellen Pinder received the Distinguished Toastmaster (DTM) award, Bradley Geelen was recognized as Employee of the Month, and the department participated in Hurricane Awareness Proclamation activities.

Fire Stations 6 & 17

On the week of May 4, groundbreaking ceremonies were held for the new Fire Station 17 and the replacement of Fire Station 6. The Fire Station projects are funded by the 2024 1% local sales tax. Fire Station 17 is located at 12019 Maryland Ave, Punta Gorda. Replacement Fire Station 6 will be located at 1020 Bloxham Ave, Punta Gorda. Both stations will be hardened facilities capable of supporting the future needs of Charlotte County residents.

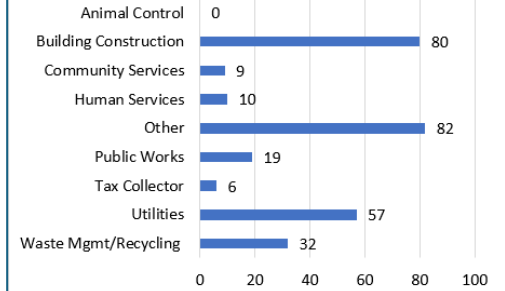


On May 5, community leaders, county staff, and residents celebrated the groundbreaking and official launch of Phase II of the sales tax-funded improvements at William R. Gaines Jr. Veterans Memorial Park. This phase includes a dedicated pickleball court, shade structure, and conversion of the existing restroom building from a septic system to a gravity sewer system.

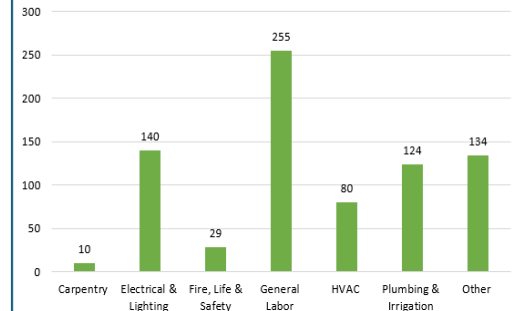
The Mid-County Regional Library Hurricane Ian Recovery project reached a major milestone with the successful ribbon-cutting ceremony held on May 11, 2026. The event brought together community members, elected officials, project stakeholders, and library staff to celebrate the library's restoration and official reopening.

The South County Annex replacement project is in the final phase of programming. It will now move into schematic design and finalize the site evaluation to determine if an alternative is required. The project is a 2020 Sales Tax project that the board advanced from Tier 2 to Tier 1 and authorized the design of a new annex facility that will primarily support the Tax Collector, Property Appraiser, as well as other constitutional offices.

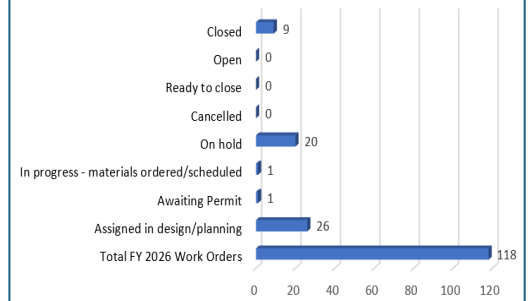
FY26 Switchboard Calls May 2026 Total Calls - 369

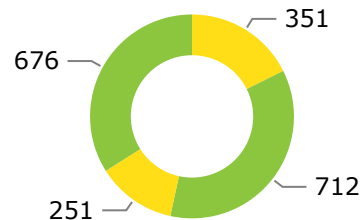

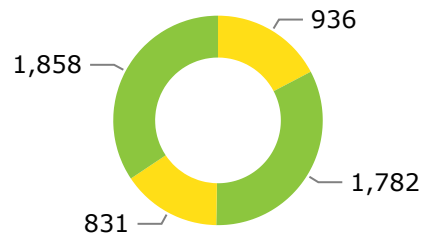

Charlotte County Fire & EMS

Charlotte County Fire & EMS celebrated several milestones this month while continuing to invest in the future of public safety. The department partnered with Charlotte Technical College and Charlotte County Public Schools to host its first-ever Signing Day Ceremony, recognizing students pursuing careers in Fire & EMS and creating a pathway to future employment opportunities. The department also welcomed new Firefighter/EMTs and Paramedics during a pinning ceremony, recognized newly promoted personnel, and celebrated Lt. Mike Brucci, Lt. Kelly Lechleidner, Lt. Jefferson Mendel, and Firemedic River Silva being named Charlotte County Employees of the Year for their actions during the Barre Drive fire. Fire & EMS was also nationally recognized with the American Heart Association's Mission: Lifeline EMS Gold Achievement Award for excellence in providing rapid, evidence-based care for heart attack and stroke patients.

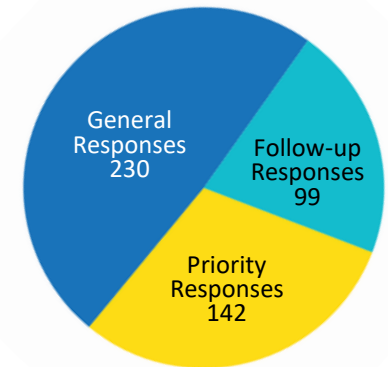
The department continued strengthening operational readiness through specialized training and community partnerships, including a live confined space rescue demonstration during Safety Week and participation in the First Responders Dive Competition, where the Marine Operations Team earned a fourth-place overall finish. Community support was on full display during EMS Week as local hospitals, healthcare partners, businesses, and residents recognized and celebrated emergency medical personnel. Fire & EMS also marked several major infrastructure investments, including the groundbreaking of the replacement Fire Station 6, the groundbreaking of new Fire Station 17 near Tucker's Grade, and the ceremonial push-in of new Engine 12 at Station 12. These projects, funded through the 1% local option sales tax, represent continued investment in the personnel, facilities, and equipment needed to serve Charlotte County's growing community.

Charlotte County Animal Control

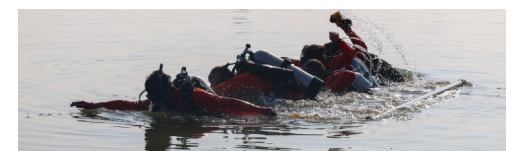
Charlotte County Animal Control continued its commitment to serving both residents and wildlife throughout the month. Animal Control Officer Breanna Beattie was recognized with an Employee Service Award after receiving positive feedback from a resident for her professionalism and compassion during a wildlife rescue involving a Red-shouldered Hawk. The recognition highlights the dedication Animal Control staff demonstrate every day while assisting the community and protecting local wildlife.

Animal Control also partnered with the Florida Department of Health in Charlotte County to support public awareness efforts following a Rabies Advisory issued in response to a confirmed rabies case in a raccoon near Jarvis Street. Staff assisted with public education and outreach, reinforcing the importance of avoiding contact with wild animals, ensuring pets are properly vaccinated, and reporting potential exposures to help protect both residents and animals.

Veterans Boulevard at Yorkshire Street Intersection Reconstruction – Progress Update

The Veterans Boulevard and Yorkshire Street Intersection Reconstruction Project is now approximately one month into active construction. This major infrastructure improvement project includes:

- Milling and resurfacing of roadway surfaces
- Widening of auxiliary lanes
- Construction of new turn lanes
- Stormwater drainage system improvements
- Installation of new street lighting

Current Progress

Contractor EHC Construction has completed several key early-stage construction activities, including:

- Removal of existing concrete curb and gutter within the median areas along Veterans Boulevard.
- Excavation and preparation of the median areas for the installation of new concrete curb and gutter and the revised median alignment.

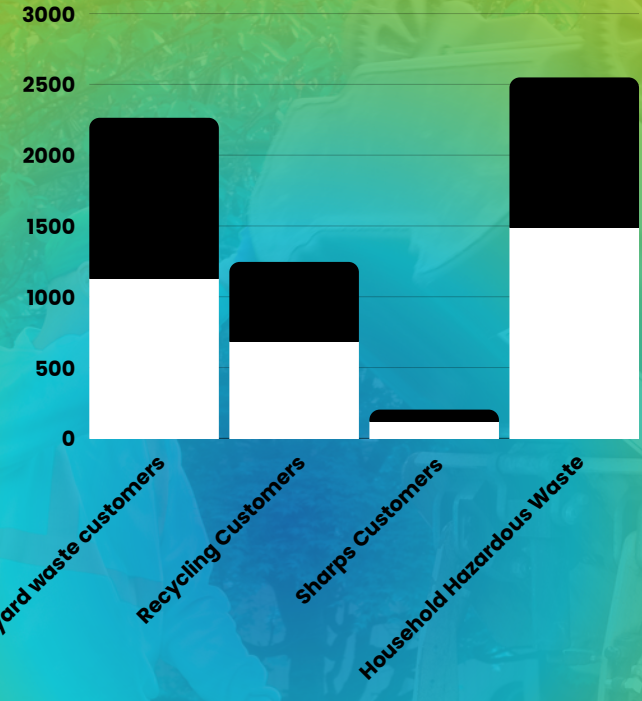
Construction activities continue to progress as scheduled, with upcoming work focused on roadway widening, drainage improvements, and continued intersection reconstruction efforts.

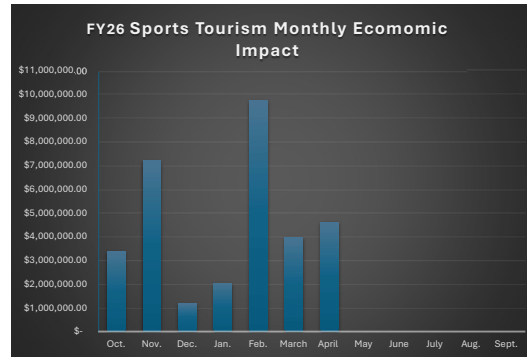

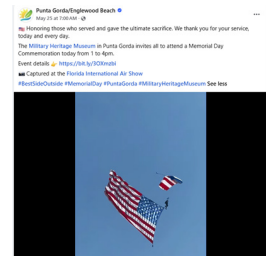

Rotonda Water Reclamation Facility Accepts Award



The Utilities Department was recognized during the Charlotte County Commission's Regular Meeting this week. Staff from the Rotonda Water Reclamation Facility proudly accepted the Earle B. Phelps Award from the [Florida Water Environment Association](#) for the plant's performance in wastewater treatment.

UNDER CONSTRUCTION



Burnt Store Water Reclamation Facility Expansion

The Board of County Commissioners approved the use of a packaged plant to temporarily increase wastewater capacity for this service area. The Commission also supports a permanent expansion of the facility. Engineering design and permitting for the expansion are on schedule.

Ackerman Septic to Sewer Project:

Water and sewer connections continue in the Ackerman MSBU to deliver more reliable infrastructure to approximately 1,300 properties. On-lot connections in Zone 2 are 85% complete and installation of sewer infrastructure in Zones 3, 4 and low-pressure sewer is 45% complete. Hillsborough Boulevard Water Main Project:

This project is installing an eight-inch Charlotte County watermain parallel to a 42-inch watermain from the Peace River Manasota Water Authority to improve service reliability. Pipe installation continues toward Cranberry Boulevard and property restorations are taking place.

East Port Water Reclamation Facility Expansion

This project will expand treatment capacity from six million to nine million gallons of wastewater per day. As part of the upgrade, advanced wastewater treatment technologies are being incorporated to produce higher quality reclaimed water. Construction is currently 90% complete.

To provide safe, reliable drinking water, reclaimed water and wastewater service for the enrichment of the community.
