Charlotte County Boater Improvement Fund / West Coast Inland Navigation District

FY 2026/2027 Grant Application

Application deadline is January 31, 2025

Effective December 11, 2024, applicants may apply for grant assistance from the Florida Boater Improvement Fund (BIF) revenues collected from boat registration fees, as well as, from the West Coast Inland Navigation District (WCIND) revenues collected from property tax assessments. No applications will be accepted or considered after the application deadline.

Who May Apply: Charlotte County government agencies and non-government organizations may apply for these funds.

Types of Grant Funding Available: There are 3 sources of grant funding available. In addition to the following specific criteria, all projects must serve a **public purpose** and benefit the community as a whole.

- WCIND. Funding for public navigation channels, boating access facilities, waterfront parks, and piers; as well as, marine and environmental education and safety programs. Projects are categorized into 5 groups; marine law enforcement (funded 100%), navigation improvement (funded 100%), environmental education (funded 100%), boater safety/education (50% match required), and boater recreation (50% match required). WCIND funding may not be used for general operations and maintenance.
- **BIF-State.** Recreational channel marking and other uniform waterway markers, public boat ramps, lifts and hoists, marine railways, public launching facilities, removal of derelict vessels, hazardous floating structures. (funded 100%)
- **BIF-Local.** Patrol, regulation, and maintenance of the lakes, rivers, and waters, as well as, other boating-related activities. (Up to 100% funding available)

General Information: This is a **cost reimbursement** program for projects that will be completed within one fiscal year; which is from **October 1, 2025 to September 30, 2026**. All unspent grant funds remaining at the end of the grant period will be retained by Charlotte County and unobligated. For extenuating circumstances, a project extension may be approved upon written request.

With submittal of the application, all non-governmental applicants <u>must</u> provide their organization's Articles of Incorporation, current Florida Not for Profit Corporation Annual Report, and/or Department of Treasury document showing 501(C)3 status and the legal name of the organization.

If awarded, the recipient of grant funds will be required to sign a funding agreement with Charlotte County outlining the obligations of both parties as it relates to the grant. Agencies awarded grant funds will be required to provide Charlotte County **quarterly reports** of project status. Additionally, agencies awarded funds for equipment, goods, or services exceeding \$5,000 in value will be required to provide Charlotte County:

- No less than 3 written bids for approval prior to purchase. If an item or service is determined by the recipient to be available from only one vendor, the recipient may request, in writing, a "sole-source" purchase authorization from Charlotte County.
- An annual report of any equipment's current use and value until the asset value falls below \$5.000.
- A formal request for disposition of equipment if it is no longer needed or used for the purpose grant funds were awarded.

Grant Application Processing Schedule:

- 12/11/2024 01/31/2025- Application Period. No applications will be accepted or considered after the deadline.
- **03/13/2025** Charlotte County Marine Advisory Committee (MAC) review and prioritization of applications for formal recommendation to Board of County Commissioners (BCC).
- May 2025- BCC reviews MAC recommendation and votes on applications.
- **July 2025-** WCIND board votes on district applications for funding.
- **July September 20**25- Grant contracts developed and signed.
- 10/01/2025. Grant term begins.

Application Instructions:

The name of the applicant's organization must be the legal title of that entity as provided on documents of incorporation or governmental designation. If a corporation, ensure the appropriate corporate designation (i.e. LLC, INC, Inc.) is included. <u>Applicants must provide documents verifying their organization's legal name</u> (Articles of Incorporation, Florida Not for Profit Corporation Annual Report, Department of Treasury 501(C)3 designation).

The Principal Officer identified must be the official who is authorized to legally bind the organization contractually.

Projects for grant funding must fall into at least one of the several categories of work. Select the category or categories that best describe your project's scope.

Briefly describe the project on the application. More detailed descriptions of the project should be attached to the application.

The applicant will indicate the total amount of grant funding requested, as well as, any funds the applicant will contribute towards the project. Not all projects require an applicant to contribute project funds; however, two categories of projects available for grant funding from WCIND require the applicant to pay for 50% of the project; referred to as matching funds. These projects are associated with boater safety and education, and boater recreation. If the applicant is requesting BIF-Local funding from Charlotte County to fund all, or a portion of, the applicant's required 50% matching funds, provide a statement as to how this additional funding is in the County's best interest.

Project permits, engineering, plans, and specifications must be paid for by the applicant, and should be complete and current at the time of application. Enter the required permits, their status, and expiration. Attach permits to the application.

The applicant must complete the project budget sheet attached to the application. Be sure to fill out all columns of the grant budget to distinguish Grant Funds budgeting and Matching Funds budgeting. If the attached budget template is insufficient for your project, the applicant may attach an alternative budget format.
