MINUTES

January 2, 2025, at 9:00 A.M.

1. Call to Order:

Wendy Lang called the meeting to order at 9:03 a.m.

Carol McCoy, citizen, was interested in the scope of work and timing of the beach renourishment. Also mentioned there was a reporting of a dead Male Loggerhead turtle.

Damian Ochab, SMSKA, reported that Red-Tide is on the Key. He announced that the sand has started to be dispersed along the key and it's about half done. There's a lot of people questioning how is this being funded? Today's the last day for debris pickup and the Key is concerned since there's still quite a lot left on the Key. He's looking for a unified plan regarding recommendations, by whoever can assist, on the armory concern regarding the rocks on the Island that's been skewed all over the Key due to the storms. People are going in the water along the shoreline on Manasota Key and they would like a water quality report to check the safety of the water.

Ms. Lang mentioned for Public Works to attend the next meeting regarding the following:

8. Old Business

• Derelict Vessel Update Report

Elizabeth Eastes commented that the DV report is still from last month, with the holidays there hasn't been many changes.

- · 2 of the CCSO cases have been removed
- 2 new CCSO cases, one is at Spring Lake a sailboat; the other is an "At-Risk" vessel

Commissioner Deutsch, asked whose responsible for the vessels that are on land by the Sunseeker?

Ms. Estates commented that she is. She has a meeting today with the owners to discuss the removal. Where it will be going through the DEP process. For the vessels on land, she is getting the owners consent for using our county code 11157 to have them removed. She then gets authorization through FDEP for the removal.

Brandon Moody, Water Quality Manager

Water Quality

Mr. Moody commented they are discussing February 20th, 2025, to be the date for the public meeting for the One Charlotte, One water plan located at the Charlotte Event Center. This was introduced to the Board of County Commissioners during their November workshop for anyone wishing to view what was discussed via the website. He mentions that the health beaches program with DOH is what handles the bacteria monitoring on the beaches and coast.

• Parks and Natural Resources Update

Alexandria Grant, Natural Resources, informed the board that they are preparing for Shorebird season, that's coming February 15th.

The final count for turtles:

- o Total 1530
- Leatherback 1
- o Kemps Ridley -1
- o Green 55
- o Loggerheads 1473

This was a projected lower year, so the numbers line up with our projection. A beach cleanup was done on November 14th and 18th for Don Padro, Knight Island and Palm Island. On December 11th, they also cleaned up Boca Grande from Hurricane debris. They have finally received a contact for LGI.

Damian Ochab, SMSKA, spoke about the sand out on Manasota Key Beach; what's the plan with the removal and putting back of the sand. Is there a way for half of the public beach to be opened on Manasota Key? People are here now and it doesn't seem that there's a plan to open it.

Mr. Matias responded that the opening up half the beach is with Parks and Recreation.

There was a discussion about the sand dunes on the beaches.
