Welcome and     Roll Call	The meeting was called to order by Chairman, Angela Hogan at 1:00 pm. A quorum was present.				
2. Approve Agenda	The agenda was approved, as amended to revise the date of the Community Leadership Breakfast.				
3. Public Input	Jeff Lustig, Resident praised the CC Transit system's free bus service and the new reservations app. Public Input closed by motion Joe Tiseo and seconded by Paul Polk and unanimous vote.				
4. Minutes	July 2024 minutes approved as presented by motion of Joe Tiseo seconded by Lynn Dorler, and unanimous vote.				

5. County Health and Needs Assessment	Dr. Joe Pepe explained to members that the State gave the CAAAB permission to merge the county health assessment (CHA) with the CAAAB's community needs assessment (CNA) in 2019 to create the Community Health and Needs Assessment (CHNA), and keep both on the same 5-year review cycle. He said that the 2025 CHNA was started in February 2024 and he reviewed the timetable of actions that were taken and passed out copies of the executive summary. Gabe Fuster and Miranda Pitt provided a Powerpoint presentation and discussion on the findings, which will be officially released at the February 2025 Community Champions Leadership Breakfast. Members were invited to attend the breakfast which will ne held 2/24/25 at 8:30 am at the Charlotte County Event Center. Colleen Turner noted that the members needed to vote to accept the outcomes of the assessment report. Lynne Dorler made a motion to approve as presented and Diane Munson seconded, the vote was unanimous.	
6. Family Services Center Updates	<ul> <li>2024 FSC Partners Annual Report - preparation is in process, 100% of the 1 on 1 partner meetings have taken place and all required data has been collected. 7. Human Services Reorganization	Carrie Walsh explained reorganization plans forHuman Services. She introduced new managers: Margaret Selberg-Intake, Matthew McGee-Veterans, and Tara Blackson- Family Stability all were promoted. Neighborhood Services will be split into Neighborhood Services and Family Stability. Three new positions created for the Neighborhood services division to support future CDBG grants and disaster response efforts: CDBG Program Coordinator, Sr. Program Coordinator and Resiliency Manager.	
8. Programs and Funding	The Human Services leadership team gave an overview of funding and programs offered by the Department.	
9. Ad Hoc Committee Update	India Davis provided an update, noting that they will be having a Senior/ Veterans Social on February 28th at the FSC from 11:00 - 1:00 and the theme will feature heart health.	
10. Member Recruitment	The Career Source Center asked that Anna Godadze replace Kim Dextra as their representative on the board, Lynn Dorler made a motion to approve and Cara Reynolds seconded, motion carried unanimously. There is one vacancy for the private sector and Angela Hogan made a request for nominations.	
11. Member Comments	<ul> <li>Gulf Coast Partnership - Angela Hogan reported that Kevitt Park in Englewood was reopened and emergency hotel housing was ending in January. The merger between the Homeless Coalition and St. Vincent DePaul's was complete; STARS Academy Child Care is open and accepting applications from low-income families and has an essential workers scholarship.
