

MEETING MINUTES
GULF COVE STREET & DRAINAGE ADVISORY COMMITTEE
July 21, 2008
7:00 p.m.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Business:

- Six residents were present at the meeting.
- Ms. Musselman explained the proposed paving schedule, which consists of 12.5 miles of roads. The Committee suggests increasing the tax assessment by \$25.00 per lot, per year, for 10 years.
- Ms. Musselman said ad-valorem taxes do not pay for street and drainage maintenance.
- The meeting is to provide residents with the reasoning for the tax increase, before it is presented to the Board of County Commissioners on July 28, 2008.
- A resident asked who to contact about potholes and was directed to Public Works.
- Ms. Musselman stated that paving will consist of 1¾" Type S asphalt but depends on the condition of the road, so some roads may get a thicker application. Once the roads are paved, they will receive two coats of rejuvenation within the first few years, which will extend their life span to 20 to 25 years.
- Public Works follows Florida Department of Transportation specifications.
- A resident said the cul-de-sac roads leading to the canals are in bad shape and blown out. Ms. Musselman requested a list of these roads and said the MSBU does not have enough money to inspect all the roads. Rand Terrace was recently paved for \$120,000.
- A resident inquired about the use of petro-mat, which is placed down and paved over. The life span of a road using this material is 40 years. Mr. Crafton suggested this be presented to Mr. Dan Quick.
- There was discussion about responsibility for the patch of road between David and Foresman. Ms. Musselman will check into it.
- Ms. Musselman encouraged everyone to attend the July 28, 2008, public hearing and express their opinion.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:19 p.m.
