



Shuttle Service from the Englewood Health Center to the North Port Health Center

The Charlotte County Transit Division will be providing, at no charge, transportation services between the Englewood Health Center and North Port Health Center. This service is on a trial basis and will begin with a one-month temporary service schedule from Sept. 3 through Oct. 4, 2013. The Englewood Health Center will no longer be open as of Aug. 31 and this transportation service will help residents travel to and from the North Port Health Center where affordable health care is available.

Currently, walk-in appointments are not available. Before receiving care, all new North Port Health Center patients must go through an eligibility process. Individuals can call to schedule an eligibility appointment at 941.861.3825. Additionally, once eligible, every patient must make an appointment to see a provider; the appointment cannot be scheduled the same day as the eligibility appointment. To make an appointment to see a provider please call 941.861.3820.

The Englewood Health Center is located at 6868 San Casa Drive, Englewood, Florida. (Pickup location is at the south side of building by parking lot)

The North Port Health Center is located at 6950 Outreach Way, North Port, Florida. (Pickup location is at the south side of building by Outreach Way)



Florida Department of Health in Sarasota Cost of Services

The Department of Health in Sarasota and the North Port Health Center work to make sure its services are available to as many people as possible. The cost of a service depends on your ability to pay. Some services are always free; others require you to pay if you have the ability. Your ability to pay is determined by the Eligibility office. The best way to find out the cost of a particular service, once you know your eligibility status, is to contact that service directly. Eligibility Requirements at DOH-S

Sarasota County Health Department offers many services that are available to anyone; other services require you to meet certain eligibility requirements prior to receiving the service.

Age Requirement: DOH-S serves residents under 55 years of age. Residents aged 55 years and older should contact the [Senior Friendship Center](#) for health services.

Services available to anyone (no eligibility requirements, though some require financial screening and/or fees for services):

- Birth control (contraceptives)
- Family planning
- Childhood immunizations (vaccinations)
- Immunizations for foreign travel
- Sexually transmitted disease (STD) testing, treatment, and counseling.

Other services are available only to persons determined to be eligible.

Clinic Cards

You must have a Clinic Card to receive some services at DOH-S. Eligibility specialists work with new clients to go over their individual situations and documentation.

To obtain a Clinic Card, go to the Eligibility office at [the North Port Health Center](#), 6950 Outreach Way, North Port, Florida, 34289. You must provide:

- Identification
 - (*U.S. citizens*) Government-issued photo identification
 - (*Citizens of other countries in the U.S. on a visa*) Passport and I-94 form. Additional documentation may be required.
 - (*Resident aliens*) Residency card ("Green Card"). Additional documentation may be required.
- Social Security cards for all in your family
- No one is refused health care. However, anyone seeking our services must participate in an eligibility screening process and pay their fair share on a sliding fee scale based on income and family size. Be advised that proof of Sarasota County residency is required by certain facilities that handle referrals from primary care providers.
- Proof of income for the last four weeks for everyone in your family. (If you are self-employed, bring your most recent completed tax return.)
- The most recent bank statement(s) from any household member account(s)
- At your initial visit, SCHD may require you to provide verification in addition to that listed above.
- Additional requirements: Individual [Health Centers](#) may have specific eligibility requirements.
